In the name of God Amen. I William Stone of the County of Henry and State of Tennessee considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following (that is to say). First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Stone all the tract of land whereon I now reside containing something like six hundred acres with all the appurtenances thereto belonging during her natural life time and in case she should want to sell it during her lifetime she is to be considered at full liberty to do so but the proceeds to be equally divided amongst my children (to wit) John Stone, Nancy Williams, Jonathan Stone Eliza Stone, Betsey Ann Stone, Ephraim Lane Stone & William L. Stone except one third which is to remain in her possession during her life. I also give and bequeath to her one Black mare and one sorrel mare and the colts that she has now

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sluicing with the house hold & kitchen furniture and my negro man Jack. I wish her to keep also or to clop for one that she might think would suit her better for the maintenance, support & schooling of my young children, and also the crop that is growing on the plantation, and killing hogs sufficient to make two thousand weight of pork also four cows & calves and one beef and two sows and fifteen shoats. I also give and bequeath to my son Jonathan Stone one sorrel mare that is now called Jonathan's mare, saddle and bridle all the residue of my stock and property I wish to be sold on a credit of twelve months and out of the proceeds thereof as much to be paid to my youngest children as the oldest one has got and the ballance to remain in the hands of my wife during her lifetime. Whom I hereby appoint executrix and James Leaper executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 9th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty. In the name of God amen, I David Gray of the County of Henry and State of Tennessee, being weak of body, but of a sound mind and memory, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, and knowing that my soul has in a few minutes to leave this transient of clay to soar to worlds unknown with a strong hope of future happiness, do make publish and ordain verbally this my last will and Testament in manner and form to wit.

Item 1st I will and bequeath that my Executors hereafter named first pay all my just debts.

Item 2^d My devise is that all the balance of my Estate be put in one general stock or fund at my plantation until my eldest son Thomas Gray becomes of age except as is hereafter provided for.

Item 3^d My will and desire is that my beloved wife Eliza Gray remain on my plantation premises and raise my children. I want her to have the use of my plantation, and of my negro man Brodson, and the household and kitchen furniture and as much of my stock of horses cattle dogs and farming tools as will be necessary for the use of the family, and if there should be any thing more than support raised I want the surplus to be sold and put into the general stock or fund. But if my beloved wife Eliza Gray should marry I give and bequeath unto her, an equal share with each of my children, to be drawn from the general stock.

If my beloved wife Eliza Gray should not survive,
I wish her to keep my children together, and her
first to remain in the general stock or fund, until
the youngest child becomes of age, then for her
to draw her part to remain unto her forever.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my beloved son
Thomas Gray, an equal share of all my estate to
be drawn from the general stock when he becomes
of age. Then the balance of my estate to be
put in one general stock, until Annemata Gray
becomes of age.

Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my beloved
daughter Annemata Gray an equal share to be
drawn out of the general stock.

Item 6th If my beloved wife Eliza Gray should
be delivered of a child, which she is now in travail
with, and it should live, until it becomes of
age, I give and bequeath unto it an equal
share with the rest of my living above mentioned.

Proviso - The Division to be share and share alike about between
the above named being or legatees.

and lastly I do hereby appoint Crawford Madford
David S Brown & James Gray or any two of them
my executors to attend to the business of my estate
until it is legally taken out of their hands
without any other appointments or my children
becoming of age - this the 4th day of May 1831
made in the presence of us
