I Henry Stith of Henry County and State of Virginia being about to go to Virginia & make to this my last Will and Testament in form and manner following that is to say I do give unto Mrs Mary Stith the Widow of Brother Andrew all the property that I purchased at the sale of Andrew Stiths Estate and which is now in her possession and I also give her a Cow and Calf that I purchased at Benjamin Williams Sale and is now also in her possession to her and to her Heirs for ever I also give said said Mary 300 ^{lbs} of Pork to be delivered her when my Pigs are slaughtered next Winter

2nd I give to Annand Stith two Milk Cows two Sows and pigs One yoke of Oxen and an Ox and a Sorel Colt called Jim and a Horse thirty Barrels of Corn two stacks of fodder 800 ^{lbs} of Pork and two hundred Dollars to her and to her Heirs for ever provided never the less that this bequest is made on by the following Conditions that is to say that the said Annand shall and does Relinquish all Claim or Claims which she has or thinks she has against me or against my Estate But if the said Annand shall or does prefer any Claim of any description against me or against my Estate then and for that Case I do hereby renounce and void every bequest to said Annand as completely as if her name had never been mentioned in this Will and leave unto the Heirs of said Annand with my Executors.

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3rd I give all the residue of my Estate of every description what so ever to my two Daughters Eliza Caroline & Mary Stith and Elizabeth Stith the one man in Virginia to them and their Heirs for ever to be equally divided between them and I also give to my two Daughters all that property which is divided to Annand Stith to them and theirs with the provided the said Annand Stith does not comply with the conditions on which this bequest is made

4th It is my wish that my Executors sell my perishable property and a credit of twelve months and pay all my debts as soon as the situation of affairs will admit of it and rent the plantation for one year obliging the renters not to put any of the land in corn that is now in corn and also to keep up the fence the grove and to return all the premises as well as good order as he or she receives them and to do with the distillery what he thinks most beneficial to my Children in this to rent it or to sell the stills and all the appertinances and furniture belonging

5th I do hereby constitute and appoint my Brother James Stith Executor to this my last Will and Testament given under my hand and seal this 30th day of June 1832 Henry Stith the Testator State of Virginia Henry County Court before us Term 1833 Then the foregoing writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Henry Stith late of said County deceased was presented Opened and thereupon read and James Harvey Williams Caldwell and Grand H. Watson who after being duly sworn

and that they believe the said paper writing is in
