The last will and testament of John Swift of Henry County and State of Tennessee I John Swift being of sound and perfect mind and memory (Blessed be allmighty for the same) do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following - First I will after my death that all my just debts be fully paid and shall ispend out of my personal estate and effects - secondly I leave unto my beloved wife Mary Swift during her natural life all my real and personal estate with the appurtenances thereto it being the place I now live on together with all my freehold estate whatsover - neither in otherwise disposed of now at the decease of my said wife, Mary Swift I give and bequeath unto my two sons Gasland Swift and Richard Swift the tract of land I now live on it being two hundred & fifty acres of land that I purchased of Joseph Looney to be equally divided between the two share and share alike and should either of them decease without a lawfull heir the legacy of the deceased one shall go to the other and should both the one die without a lawfull heir their whole estate hereby bequeathed by my will shall be equally divided amongst the rest of the legatees, Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Virginia Louisa Swift one negro man by the name of Edmund and in event said boy Edmund should die before my wife Mary Swift then and in that case My daughter Virginia L. Swift shall come in equal share with the rest of my sons & Daughters in the personal part of my estate, Fourthly I give and bequeath all the residue of my estate be it of whatsover kind it may unto my following

Children (to wit) Arthur Swift James

Swift Anna Winn Marietta Matias Marietta Swift
and Emma Swift their heirs and assigns forever
to be divided among them equally each to have
and share alike with this exception that my
two single daughters are to consider and claim
the above mentioned place given to Garland &
Richard Swift as their home and residence
during the time they are either of them remain
in single and no longer. Testify I make and
ordain Garland Swift, and Arthur Swift
Executors of this my estate will and testament
Testify it is likewise my will and wish that
Garland Swift and Arthur Swift act as
Guardian for all my said children who may not
be of age at my decease during their minority
