

Records, Bonds, Wills &c

Know all persons by these presents that I Joseph Peters of Paris, County of Henry and State of Tennessee, do make and ordain this as my last will and testament viz:

After the payment of all my just debts and Funeral Charges: I give and bequeath to my son Jeremy Peters of Paris afore said, one half of all my personal estate from and after my decease—

I give and bequeath to my said son Jeremy Peters, all my real estate and the remaining half of my personal estate in trust for the following purposes viz:

The income from my real estate to be appropriated by him the said trustee for the maintenance and support of my brother Ariel Peters of Andover in the County of Essex and State of Massachusetts to be paid at such times and manner as the said trustee may think proper excepting that no wood or timber is to be cut upon the said estate—

The half of my personal estate to be held by him in trust for my grand son Henry Peters Gray of Andover above named till he shall arrive at the age of twenty one years—

After the death of my said brother Ariel Peters, I give and bequeath to my said son Jeremy Peters, his heirs and assigns one half of said estate and I also give to my said son Jeremy Peters the remaining half of said estate after the decease of my said brother in trust for my said grand son Henry Peters Gray, until ^{and in case my said grand son should not live to the age of twenty one years} he shall arrive to the age of twenty one years— I give and bequeath the whole of said real and personal estate to my son Jeremy Peters, and I hereby authorize my son Jeremy Peters as trustee to dispose of sell at such times and terms as he may think proper or expedient all or any part of my said Real estate and to make conveyance of the same the income from its proceeds to be applied by him in trust as before directed and should my brother Ariel die before my said grand son Henry Peters Gray shall arrive at the age

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of twenty one years my said trustee is authorized to pay from the income of said property such sum or sums as he may judge proper to assist him in obtaining and education—

I hereby appoint my son Jeremy Peters Executor to this my last will and testament and I do hereby revoke all other wills before made by me = Witness my hand and seal at Paris the eleventh day of November in the year of our Lord, One Thousand eight hundred and forty one. Joseph Peters Seal

I William Porter do make and publish this as my last will and testament, hereby revoking any other heretofore made: First, I direct my debts to be paid out of the first monies that may come into the hands of my Executors—

Secondly: I devise that my Beloved wife, shall have for hers and my childrens use and benefit all of my real and personal property, during her widowhood unless during that time my Daughter or Daughters, should marry in that Event, It is my wish that each one upon her marriage should receive such property as my Executors should deem most suitable proper and necessary, not exceeding in value one fourth of my estate

Thirdly, I devise, if my wife should marry again, that my Executors, should allot to her, during her natural life, one fourth of my whole property, and at the same time, to divide the remainder of my property equally among my children = Fourthly, I devise after the death of my wife, that the life estate herein given her, be also by my Executors, equally divided among my children. Further should my wife die, before my Daughter or daughters marry

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then I wish my estate to be equally divided among them.

Fifthly, Should my Daughter or Daughters die without an heir, I desire the estate herein given, be divided among my surviving children = " Sixthly, I do authorize & empower my Executors if they deem it necessary to the security and happiness of my Daughters to convey to them before or after their marriage, and for their separate use and benefit the above bequeathed property. - " Seventhly, I do hereby authorize my Executors to sell, convey, and give generally whatsoever to such of my property as they may deem necessary and proper either for the payment of my debts, or for the benefit of my wife and children = " Lastly, I do nominate and appoint my Brothers Thomas H. Porter, and George M. Porter my Executors, with all the necessary powers to settle my affairs and carry into execution my wishes as above expressed - without requiring of them any Bond or security for the performance of the Trust confided to them. - " In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Third day of September Eighteen hundred and forty three Signed and Sealed in the presence of
