Furthermore my Will and desire is that the before mentioned old negro man Jim Haney and the old negro woman Jude shall be at liberty after my death to live with any of my children that they may think proper a fit & the shall not be compelled to do any kind of labour further than they may think proper to do and should such children or children whom the might feel a willingness to live with not being inclined to feed and clothe the said Negroes Jim Haney & Jude without the consent of their labours then and in that case my Will is that my Executors shall return in their hands a sufficiency of the money arising out of the before mentioned sale to have them well provided for as they may think proper both as to food and clothing during their natural lives for their servants herebefore to me and there deposited

My Will furthermore my Will and desire is that the before named negro woman Lucy shall be valued by the three persons that may be chosen by my Executors to value and set out my other Negroes and she shall be at liberty to make choice of which of my children she may wish to live with and such child agreeing to receive her shall pay over to my other children the proportion of her value Furthermore my Will is my before mentioned negro boy Allert now about six years old after my death shall be hired out by my Executors and proceeds arising from his labour or hire shall be paid over annually to my son James B. Loue and at the death of my said son James B. Loue the said negro boy Allert shall be sold and the money arising from the sale of said boy Allert shall be equally divided amongst my children that is to say John D. Loue my son Thomas B. Loue my daughter Sarah wife of David Coleman my son Samuel C. Loue my daughter Martha wife of George W. Prater and Allert & Loue and further never my Will is all my lands that I have pointed to be sold on a credit of not less than Twelve Months by my Executors or any part of them may be sold at any time when my Executors may think most advisable And do hereby make and Ordains my son Samuel C. Loue my son Allert & Loue & my son James George W. Prater Executors of this my last Will and Testament

Also a cow and calf or ten dollars as she may choose & finally unto Polly & Barbara I give a negro girl named Betty, a bed and furniture a cow and calf or ten dollars as she may please for together with each other articles as I shall make her equal with her sisters before named & finally I give unto my daughter Lucy Caroline one negro girl named Matilda a bed and furniture also a cow and calf or ten dollars as she may please for also such other articles so as to make ^{her} equal with her other sisters above named. Lastly I give unto my son John H Harris a negro boy named Ned also the plantation and tract of land where I now live containing 187 acres as per deed from Henry B. Buser to me also one bed and furniture and no more nor is he to have any share of what or in what that is here after to be divided.
