The whole amounting to nineteen hundred and thirty six dollars the ballance to make him equal to James Linwiddie he is to receive out of my Stock or Negroes. To my son Moses Linwiddie I will and bequeath three hundred and forty acres of land purchased from Joseph Coult for which he has my bond for a title &c likewise at one thousand dollars in my Estate I likewise give to Moses Linwiddie my land in the knolls in Madison County Kentucky that I made use of for a Stock farm One third of my Stock of Cattle Sheep and hogs is already the property of said Moses Linwiddie and not belonging to me I give and bequeath to Moses Linwiddie my Negroe boy named Allen in consequence of his not being in full possession of his part of my property at three hundred dollars in his part of my Estate likewise my plantation purchased from Elliott that I am now improving at one thousand and Seventy five dollars in case he will comply with the terms here after mentioned (which is to say) if he the said Moses Linwiddie will give his Mother or Sarah Linwiddie a decent comfortable living during her natural life if she chooses to live with him or to pay for such living where she may choose to stay in that case if the above terms is

Next to my daughter Jane Gilbert I give and bequeath three hundred acres of land on the South side of a survey of 640 acres purchased from Joseph Coult the ballance of the lot not given to Moses Linwiddie likewise a negroe woman named Fannable and her increase likewise a negroe boy named Nathan Jackson likewise a Negroe Boy named London and of Mr William Linwiddie and Thomas Linwiddie is made equal to James Linwiddie then the ballance of my Negroes & Stock is to be equally divided between my children (viz) William James Thomas Jane Gilbert and Moses Reed Linwiddie, be it understood that all the property out of my Estate (viz) Negroes land Money and every species of property coming to Jane Gilbert out of my property I give into the hand of James Linwiddie as Trustee for Jane Gilbert and her children and Samuel Gilbert is never to have the least control over any part of the same in any manner whatever but is entirely at the disposal of the said Trustee for the use of her and her children as he and the said Jane may advise and the said Samuel have nothing to do with it as though the said devise had never been made.
