HISTORY OF BAKERVILLE MISSION METHODIST RPISCOPAL CHURCH, SOUTH BAKERVILLE TENNESSEE

History of M. E. Church South, Bakerville Mission, Liberty, Bakerville, Tennessee.

The first and original church was a huge log house some 24 ft. square with large brick chimney, and fire place, and fitted up with split-log benches for seats, and was also fitted with broad plank for writing desks, and was used for both school teaching, and preaching until the house now in use was built.

The log house stood between the one now in use and the public road, of dwas built by the pioneer settlers of Cherry Bottom in about 1850. It was used for school purposes until about 1875 or 6, and then sold to R. W. Fowlkes, and moved by him to his farm some three-fourths of a mile north, and was used by him as a barn until it burned sometime in the eighties.

The frame building now used was built about 1869 or 70 by the leading men of the neighborhood. All of the lumber used in that building was cut in sight of where the house now stands on the farm of M. L. Fowlkes, which farm had an abundance of heavy timber growing upon it at the time.

The new church was dedicated to the worship of God about 1870, and the dedication sermon was preached by Dr. A. L. P. Green. The pulpit of the Historic Church has been filled by such men as: Fountain E. Pitts; R. L. Fagan; John Bolton, T. L. Moody, H. B. Reemes; R. R. Jones; John W. Hensley; J. J. Comer; J. Allison Malloy; J. T. Bleckwood; E. L. Gregory; A. P. Walker and E. C. Shelton and some others whose names cannot now be remembered. These men served as Presiding Elders.

The Regular Pastors were such men as Rhodes, John Reynolds, Will Al'en Turner; John W. Rooker; D. H. Berriman, John W. Hensley; Jasper Nichols; C. S. Gobard; John Davis; Allen Tribble; Cole; E. T. Gregory; P.T. Martin; John Handlen; Filder; Bro. Smith; T. L. Duncan; G. S. Flowers; and local preachers.

This church has been served by some wonderful men as Stewards, Sunday School Superintendents, and a host of Godly women.

For the sum of \$150.00 in hand paid, we, N. H. Hooper and wife, Mattie D., have this day sold one-half interest in one town lot, situated in the Town of Bakerville in the 12 Civil district, Humphreys County, Tennand do hereby convey unto the N. E. Church South the same, and we, N. H. Fowlkes, and wife, Brinie E, do this day donate our half interest in the above said lot to the M. E. Church South, so long as said property is held and ased as a parsonage in the bounds of Liberty Circuit. Bounds as follows: on the east by William Hickman heirs; an the south by W. Myatt; on the west by W. H. Fowlkes, and Co., and on the north by N. H. Fowlkes and Co., Beginning at a stone at Mm. Hickman's heirs N. C., running west 7 poles and 14 links to a stone; thence south 12 3/4 poles to a stake in Mm. Myatt's N. B. L., thence east 7 poles and 14 links to a stake in said line; thence north 12 3/4 poles to the beginning, containing one-half acre more or less.

M. H. Hooper and life and I. H. Fowlkes' and wife are lawfully possessed of said lot and have a right to convey the same.
