DEED CHRISTIAN CHURCH & SCHOOLS WHITLEYVILLE, TENNESSEE

This Deed from A. W. Draper - 1880, to the Christian Church and Schools of Whitleyville, Tennessee, is registered in land deed book C, pages - 478 and 474, Jackson County, Tennessee.

Et als Trustees for Christian Church .

Know all men by these present. Greetings: That I, A. W. Draper, of the County of Jackson and State of Tenmessee, have this day made a deed of gifts unto G. W. Birdwell, H. W. Rehorn, Sr., John S. Draper, J. M. Burroughs (Burris) and W. B. Roddy as Trustees, subjects to any changing the church may see proper to make, all of whom now belongs to the Christian Church.

A certain tract or parcel of land lieng in the county and State above naimed, on Jennings Creek, in Dist. No. 13, of the above naimed county and State and beunded as Pollows, to wit:

Beginning at a stake in A.W. Draper's South boundary line, it being the division line between said braper and James M. Willmore - running thence nearly North ninety eight feet to a stake near the corner of A.W. Draper's Stone house themee nearly West three hundred and two feet crossing Journey (Germany) branch a short distance to a stake in the line between said Draper and Willmore and near the mouth of said branch. Themee nearly East with said line two hundred seventy six feet to a stake the beginning corner containing - - - acres to have and to hold the same to the above named trustees and their suckeessors (successors) - for the youse (use) and benefit of the christian church and for school purposes.

I do covenant with the said trustees that I am osized of said land and have a good right to convey the same and that the same is uncumbered.

I further covenant and bind myself and my heirs and legal representives to warrant and defend the title to said land and every part theirof to said Trustees and their suckseeders, and against the lawful claims of all persons whatsoever.

But this deed is made for the following purposes, and for no other, and to build there on a house to belong to thee Christian Church and to be yoused (used) as a schoolhouse by consent of the subscribers, or the persons the pays for this building of said house.

The land is not deeded, nor intended to bee command for the purpose of building theiron a free schoolhouse, but to bee yoused as a schoolhouse subject to the majority of the men, who pays for the same, if said Christian Church and school should abandon said land at any time for the period of three years without a legal and lawful excuse, then the title to said land is to return to the original owner or his legal representatives, therwise

to remain in full force and effect for the purposes hearin contained.
