FACTS REGARDING  
CHURCH OF CHRIST AT BAGDAD.  
ON SALT LICK CREEK JACKSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE.

THE CHURCH OF CHRIST congregation at Bagdad, is over a hundred years old. In 1843 they decided to build a house where the congregation could meet together for worship. And Maj. THOMAS DRAPER gave one acre of ground, and later THOMAS HIDDLESTON gave one acre of ground.

The following is a diagram of the CHURCH OF CHRIST at BAGDAD, meeting house & grounds.



During the war (1861 - 1865), the original deeds were misplaced or destroyed in some way. The CHURCH now holds a deed obtained from the court of Jackson County.

Uncle Sammy DeWitt, among, if not, the first Minister to preach to the CHURCH OF CHRIST at BAGDAD.

Capt. James Young Elder, Thomas Hiddleston Elder, and Maj. Thomas Draper Elder among the oldest members and Elders.

(The above information given by H. C. Clark, has lived all of his life (except a few years and then near this Church.) He is also an Elder in the church now nearing his 79th birthday.)

The above named H. C. Clark has in his possession and care the Church Register which dates from 1844 to the present year (1936), and among the old volumes is found one Vol. The property of Thomas Draper Apr. 12, 1838 & 1831. Now the property, of H. C. Clark.)

Perrell and Samuel DeWhit.

 Slaughter having heretofore been Nominated, was now selected and set  
 apart and Ordained as an Evangelist with Fasting and Prayer, and the laying  
 on of Hands. From henceforth he will act as an Evangelist according to the  
 Rules and Regulations laid down in the New Testament of our LORD JESUS CHRIST  
 during the pleasure of the Church.

Mr Deason Fete. Dear Brother in Christ, I will avail myself of the present opportunity of addressing you a few lines hoping that they may find you and yours in the full enjoyment of health and happiness.

But my main object in writing is to request through you a letter of recommendation, from the Church at Bagdad, for myself and brother, that is letter on separate pieces of paper as Oliver wishes to attach himself to the Mount Pleasant congregation near this place. I am not settled yet.. consequently I can't tell where my lot will be cast.

Brother Fete, I will send with this a petition from myself and brother which you may present to the Church if you prefer. So I must Confess my total ignorance of custom or usage in such cases.. I suppose I have said enough on this subject.

We have had quite an interesting meeting at Mount Pleasant, resulting in about twenty addition to the Church; Some, however, only had their membership moved from other places; Some were from the Baptist and Methodist and eight from the world.

The Brethren at this place have finished a new meeting house at a lot of cost of about (\$2000.00) two thousand dollars. and they seem to be in a prosperous condition at present, but enough of this.

Times are dull and quite here. wheat crops were generally good. Oats rather indifferent, corn generally looks tolerably well.

We have suffered some here on account of dry weather, but have had several nice rains within the last five days.

The worst scourge and the greatest objection that I have yet found to this country, is what they call the chink bugs. these little monsters (not more than one third as large as a house fly.) are raised up in the wheat which is generally ripe before they are old enough to damage it much. but look out for the corn that is next to it; for no sooner is the wheat cut than the little heroes make a charge on the adjoining cornfields. and it is no uncommon thing to see four or five and sometimes ten acres of corn totally destroyed in one field. But whither am I wandering.

Health is generally good this country at present, but I must close.

Please accept my highest regards and christian love and give the same to your family.

Hoping to hear from you as soon as practicable. I am with due respect Your brother in the one drop.
