I. William Gray, Jun. of the County of Jackson and State of Tennessee of the consideration of Twenty three dollars to me in hand paid. I have this day deeded and transferred and confirmed unto the heirs of George Teel deceased, of over twenty three acres of land in said county and state aforesaid and on Jenning's Creek, adjoining the lands of the heirs of George Teel, deceased (I, having sold it to him before his decease), butted and bounded as follows. Beginning at a beach my northeast corner, running west about 40 poles to a white oak on the top of a ridge, thence with a conditional line made by me and George Teel, about 40 poles to a poplar, thence northward to the first branch running west of a dripping spring, thence up the main branch with its meanders to my north boundary line of George Teel's 34 agre tract, thence with same to the beginning, to have and to hold with all and singular the hereditements and appertenances thereunto belonging. or in anywise appertaining to the only use of the heirs of George Teel, dec'd. forever and I futher agree that I will warrant and defend the right and title to the above described land against the claims of all persons whatever in to stamony whereof I have hereunto set my name this 9th, day of April 1851, Signed, Sealed and Delivered in the presents of,

This Indenture made February the twenty-seventh in the year of Our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty seven, by and between John Teel of the County of Jackson and State of Tennessee, of the one part and Was H. Graves of the County of aforesaid of the other part, witnesseth that the said John Teel, for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand dollars to be paid, the receipt for is hereby acknowledged hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said Wade H. Graves and assigns a certain tract, or parcel of land situated and lying in the County of Jackson and on the waters of Jenning's Creek, the following tract, or percel of land to wit; containing two hundred and forty acres more or less, situated in the County of Jackson, State of Tennessee, in district number four on the waters of Jenning's creek, beginning on the south side of said creek beginning at a white ash and lynn, running north crossing said creek and to the top of the first ridge, thence westerly on the extreme height of the ridge to George Teel's east boundary line of a five hundred and twenty acre tract of land to a stake in said line, thense north two hundred and sixty poles to a stake in the north boundary line, thence west to a large poplar, where said line crosses the most westerly and largest fork of the spring branch that Thomas Hevelian lived on, thence down said branch with the meanders, running east of a dripping spring to an elm and said branch near the improvement, thence northeast about five poles to a beech, thence eastwardly about twenty poles to a small beech, thence a straight line crossing the top of said ridge to a stake in Clark's line. thence running with Clark's line to a stake in Shoulders' line, thence with Shoulders' line to a stake in Draper's line, thence with Draper's line to the beginning, containing the above mentioned acres, be the same more or less, to have and to hold the aforesaid tract, or parcel of land with all and singular to the right benefit and profits of, in and to the same belonging, or in anywise appertaining to the only proper use, benefit and behalf of him, the said Wade H. Graves, his heirs forever and the said John Teel agree to and with the said Wade H. Graves, his heirs, that the aforesaid recited land and bargained premises, he will warrant and ever defend against the lawful right, title and interest of all and every person, or persons whatever in witness whereof the said John Teel hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his shal the date above written.

The following record was copied from the deed, which is owned at present time by Mrs. George B. Graves, Belle Meade Drive, Mashville, Tennesses. Reublin Graves is a great uncle of George B. Graves, who is a son of Wade H. Graves.

We. Vincent Mooreland, Nancy Mooreland, his wife, Patsy Graves and Lucy Graves - all of the County of Jackson and State of Tennessee, for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars, we have this day bargained, sold and conveyed unto Wade H. Graves and his heirs of the County of Jackson, State of Tennessee, all the right, title and interest that we have in and to a certain tract, or parcel of land, lying and being in the County of Jackson, State of Tennessee, on the north side of Cumberland River on the waters of Wartrace Creek, it being one half of the tract of land that Reubin Graves dec'd. seized and possessed, bounded as Tollows: Beginning on 2 sugar trees on the pop of the ridge 4 poles south of a double lynn corner, the northeast corner of Easom Graves onto tract, thence south 70 degrees, west 24 poles to a sugar tree, thence south 55 degrees. west 71 poles to a white oak. Thence south 75 degrees, west 125 poles to a beach in the most boundary line of once Rice Graves, now Elisa Lee's, thence north 77 poles to a stake 2 poles north of an onto corner on a small elm, thence north 77 degrees, east 32 poles to a buckeye, thence north 55 degrees, east 6 noles to a birch, thence north 78 degrees, east 17 poles, thence north 86 degrees, east 22 poles, thence north 55 degrees, east 90 voles, thence north 42 degrees, east 32 poles, thence south 81 degrees. east 31 poles, thence south 62 poles to the beginning, containing by survey one hundred and eighty acres and it being held of the tract of land that Reubin Graves willed to Nancy Mooreland and Edna Teel, Patsey Graves and Lucy Graves, his daughters, the above discribed tract, being Mancy Mooreland and Edna Teel's portion, which was equally divided between us four heirs. and Lucy and Patsey aforesaid, taking the other half, not here named and we never transfered our interest to each other, as divided above, consideration being to her for her interest to have and to hold to the said Wade H. Graves, his heirs and assigns forever.

We bind ourselves, our heirs and representatives to the said W. H. Graves and his heirs, to warrant and forever defend the right, title and interest in and to the said Nanoy Mooreland, interest in the foregoing discribed land against all persons whatever.
