Dear Cousin:

Meeting with a favourable opportunity of writing to you I embrace the same for we have not heard any straight account from you all in some time till the present. I met with of your neighbors passing through our County which gave us the pleasing intelligence to hear that you were all well and doing as well as the Times affords and I am now writing before day a very cold morning. My object will be to give you a short Detail on each subject as I can't write very satisfactorily on none owing to my opportunity and as self comes nearest. I shall begin with my own family. My oldest son is living in Missouri, Green County, a Presbyterian preacher and doing well. My second son died with the Colic some years past. My third son died in New Orleans of yellow fever, two daughters died two years ago of Typhoid fever grown. two died in Minority one died in Wilson County, a married daughter, left four children, one Eight days old which my wife and by her death bed request are raising. We only have two children at home with us now out of twelve.

All the Overall family is well that lives about here several dead, some moved away and others grown up.

The Ramsey family is all moved off but Ann the old Widow dead and two of her sons-in-law.

Wm Thomas family is much scattered. What is here is well. Old Aunt Franky is still living. Robert is Married a few days ago to a Miss Vaught. Old James Blackwood is dead and all the old acquaintances that you knew here is either moved off or dead and new set sprang up.

I would write more but man has to start for home.

Receive this from your affectionate Cousin in a hurry. Write to me when opportunity admits and then I will write any information you my family best respects to you and your family. Your Sister and Brother from me and My family in haste. My wife is not at home off at her daughters.

Mr. J. A. Matheny

Dear Sir --

I for the first time in life seat my self to drop you a few lines to inform you that I am in a reasonable State of health at the present time, and with regard to your health, I hope that these lines will find you enjoying the best of health.

I have nothing verry interesting to write to you. There is a large force of Cavalry here in this Vicinity There is seven Brigades I believe. Our Regt has been taken away from Gen. Forrests command and put in Gen. Armstrong's Brigade. Gen. Vanhorn's Division Wee landed here a few days ago from Florence. Our Regt is in tollerable good health at present considering the fase they have had during the past winter. Riley Becetter of Our Co. died the day wee left Florence, Ala. I suppose there is a considerable Yankee force at Franklin. Our Pickets and the Yankee Pickets is fitting every day. There was a Man came in yesterday Wounded he was shot through the head but was able to ride to Camps. Wee are expecting a general engagement here shortly. I will change the subject.

We are Camped here in the heart of Tenn. (Turn over) to next page) Where a more Beautiful Country cant be shown to the eye of living Men. I would be verry glad to see you all and give you a amawl sketch of our Travels in my Feble Manner.

It would be Anought to make a pig squeal to hear of all our scrapes that wee have had. It is thought that Col. G. G. Dibrell will be promoted to Brigadaier Gen.

Come down and see us if you can. Give my best Respects to all my Friends and reserve a good portion for yourself, and also give my best respects to Aunt Lucindia and all the rest of the Family of whom I have been so much associated with and is still associated with one of the Family J. E. M. One that is a true Friend but a dangerous Enemy.

Dear Father Mother brothers & Sisters:

I seat my self this beautiful Monday morning to drop you a  
few lines to inform you that I am well and hope when these lines come  
hand they may find you all well.

I have nothing strange to write to you at this time more than  
we have had some fighting to do We marched in to Franklin the 4th day  
of this month and run the Yankees back to their breast works and they  
reinforced with 6 thousand Cav. from Tryune and then we had to leave.

We had a fight at Tryune on the 11th of this month as hard a fight as I ever  
have been one man killed out of our Co. he  
was shot ded on his horse, his name was Frank Spivey. We are now camp-  
ed 2 miles from Spring Hill.

Mr Stephen Davis is hear and is going to start home this morn-  
ing and I have not time to write Much. I received a letter from you  
the day before dated May 22nd and one from the 1st of June. I would Write  
Not got time

(The blanks show where the words are left out by the mice hav-  
ing gnawed on the letter.)

Monday Evening.

Mr. Davis did not start this morning and I thought that I  
would write a few more lines. Our Regt is drawing money. Our Co. has  
not drawn yet. We have not drawn any Money since the 22nd of Feb.  
If we draw money before Mr. Davis starts back I will send some money  
home and if we dont draw before he starts I want you to come down and  
I will pay you well for your trip. You can get hear in four days very

(handy. You rote to me that you heard we was goin to Corinth. I dont  
think that there is much danger of us going down their  
leave hear I think that we will but I  
dont think that we will We have lots of Yankees  
to contend against at Franklin & Tryune, but we still stay able to

Editor of The Sentinel --

Dear Sir --

In an article headed "Progress of Canvass," in your issue of the 16th instant I find among other things the following:

"With regard to the Senatorship, all would appear to be working smoothly in the upper end of the district, but in Summer the disappointment and chagrin of some of Capt. J. A. Trousdale's friends is showing itself in the insinuation of The Tennessean that Col. Butler is not on the Democratic platform."

I have not seen the Tennessean, but deem it just to the party, the people generally and to myself, to take the earliest opportunity offered to state that said insinuation, and all others of like character, do me great injustice and have no foundation in truth.

I am surprised at such an insinuation being made at all, and especially by a friend of Capt. Trousdale, between whom and myself there exists the warmest personal friendship. I am satisfied that he had nothing to do with it, and that he spoke his true sentiments when he pledged his earnest and active support to the nominee of the Convention.

In regard to my political status, I will say to all concerned that I was up to the dissolution of that time-honored old party, A Whig, since which time and the late war I have acted consistently with the Democratic Party.

When my old party ceased to exist I was forced to remain outside of any party organization, or join the Republican or Democratic party. I unhesitatingly chose to cast my destiny with the latter because the issues were formerly divided the two old parties were past and dead issues; and I saw no reason why an old Whig could not fully espouse the principles of the Democratic party.

When the war broke out I unhesitatingly cast my destiny with the people of the South, enlisted in the Confederate Army where I remained, endeavoring to perform my duty till health forced me to quit the service, and on account of which I was honorably discharged from the army. Yet to the end I was in full sympathy with the devoted people of the lost cause.

Since the war I was elected Circuit Court Clerk of Jackson County (my native) county by the Democratic party; and, again, in 1870, I was elected Secretary of State as a Democrat.

I have voted all the time since the war for the nominees of Dem-



ocratic party, and zealously worked for the success of that party in every contest. The old Democrats of Jackson and Clay counties where I am best known, are warmly supporting me as the old Whigs.

I am squarely on the platform of the Democratic party of the State of Tennessee and fully endorse the principles enunciated in their platform announced on the 19th of August last in Convention at Nashville. I endorse the nominations Judge Porter for Governor and Col. J. W. Head for Congress, and am warmly supporting them both; and if I am not a Democrat I would like for the man of the Tennesseean to tell me what course an old Whig would have to pursue to make him a Democrat. I think I am as sound a Democrat and as fully espouse the principles of the National Democracy of the present day, and oppose Radicalism and Republican misrule and usurpation as strongly as the man of the Tennesseean or any other man in the District.

The Democratic party has had a cable and undisturbed possession of me more than long enough to have obtained a good indefeasible title in me under the Statute of limitations of seven years. And I claim protection under that party, and do not intend to be read out of it in a summary manner without defense in my feeble way. I wish to say through your columns to the voters of the district that since my nomination sickness in my family has prevented me from making as thorough a canvass as I hoped to do, and I may on the same account be prevented from filling my future appointments in person. Therefore I ask a place in your columns for a refutation of said unjust imputation, and would be pleased for the Tennesseean to do me the justice to copy this letter or make necessary corrections.

In conclusion I will say to the people of the district that if elected I will faithfully serve them to the best of my ability.

I will labor industriously and untiringly to procure the passage of such laws as will best advance and secure the prosperity of the whole people of the District and State at large, and I will as zealously and untiringly endeavor to prevent the enactment of all such laws as are calculated to oppress the masses and cripple the industrial interests of the country. I am opposed to the Civil Rights abomination, and to mixed schools.

I have been all my life a man of action and not of words, and if you elect me you will have a laboring, watchful Senator.
