I James Campbell of Jefferson County East Tennessee do hereby  
 make my last will and testament in manner and form fol-  
 lowing, that is I do give that my executors hereafter named may  
 sell immediately after my decease as much of my perishable  
 property as may be sufficient to satisfy all my just debts  
 that may remain unpaid and my funeral expenses, and  
 out of the monies arising therefrom pay and satisfy all the  
 above mentioned debts and expenses.

I do give & give to my wife Jane Campbell five negro slaves  
 namely Agg. Henry, Jeff, Sally and Jason to support and  
 to work for her during her natural life. I likewise give  
 the dwelling house and house furniture to her to have.



and to hold during her natural life, and the privilege of disposing of the house furniture, and of giving it to whom she pleases except one cupboard, one desk and feather bed and bedclothing that is common to belong to a bed, which I give to my son Robert F. Campbell to be possessed by him and his heirs forever, and after her decease I give the above mentioned negro Slaves, namely, Jagg, Henry, Jeff, Sally and Aaron to my Children and Grandchildren hereinafter mentioned to be divided among them in the following manner and to be enjoyed by them and their heirs forever.

1<sup>st</sup>ly I give to my daughter, Mary Fair, one negro slave named Abigail, and also her offspring, if there shall be any and another negro slave named Madison, who are now in her possession to be possessed by her & her heirs forever.

2<sup>nd</sup>ly I give to my daughter, Nancy Beck one negro slave named Esther and also her offspring, if there shall be any hereafter, and an other negro slave, a child named Valentine who are now in her possession to be possessed by her and her heirs forever.

3<sup>rd</sup>ly I give to my daughter, Margaret Fair, one negro slave named George who is now in her possession to be possessed by her and her heirs forever.

4<sup>th</sup>ly I give to my son Robert F. Campbell, a certain tract of land containing two hundred acres lying in Jefferson County, East Tennessee, joining Anthony and William Caldwell land and Aaron Newmans land, beginning at a post oak running thence due west, thirty eight poles to a stake in William Caldwell line, thence with said line, south

sixty four poles to a Black Oak, William Caldwell's corner thence South sixty west one hundred and fifty eight poles to a stake William Caldwell and Aaron Newmans corner thence along said Newmans line South thirty four west one hundred and thirty eight poles to a post oak and stake, thence due East two hundred and thirty four poles to a stake, thence a direct line to the Beginning, to be possessed by him, and his heirs forever, except so much as will bring a decent support for my wife Jane Campbell which exception, is only, to continue during her natural life. I likewise give to him all the farming utensils to be possessed by him and his heirs forever. I also give him two negro Slaves, one named Ben and the other named Sake to be possessed by him and his heirs forever.

5<sup>th</sup>ly I give to my granddaughter, Jane Vance, one negro slave named Sally and also her offspring, if there shall be any to be possessed by her and her heirs forever.

6<sup>th</sup>ly I give to my granddaughter, Amelia M. Vance one negro slave named Aaron to be possessed by her and her heirs forever.

7<sup>th</sup>ly I give to my granddaughter, Eliza Vance, one negro slave named Ben who is now at her fathers, to be possessed by her and her heirs forever.

8<sup>th</sup>ly After the decease of my wife Jane Campbell I desire that my executors may sell the above named negro Slaves, Henry and Jeff and the monies arising therefrom to be divided into six equal parts and a sixth to be given to each of my five Children, namely, Elizabeth

Campbell, Mary Fain, Nancy Pick, Margaret Fain and Robert F. Campbell, and the above mentioned slave Agg I also give to my son Robert F. Campbell to be possessed by him and his heirs forever, and the other sixth of the money to be divided among my grandsons namely my daughter Elizabeth Vances sons, each to have an equal part. Wtly. The reason why I have not given more to my son Archibald Campbell, is because I have given him a deed for a certain track of land.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons Archibald Campbell and Robert F. Campbell, Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other, or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made.

In witness whereof I have herunto set my hand & seal this 18th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty six.
