weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thankes to God
for it and calling to mind the mortality of my body and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make
and declare this my last will and testament that in principally
and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God who gave it And my body I recommend to
the dust to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the
discretion of my executors nothing doubting but I shall re
ceive the same at the general resurrection. And touching
the worldly estate wherewithal I hath pleased God to bless me in
this life I give demise and dispose of in the following manner
and form Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my three
sisters Rachael, Esther and Sarah the sum of five shillings

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each to be paid to them out of my estate. Item I give and bequeath unto my sister Charity One sord Mare and colt; also one other three years old and all my cattle. Also I do order that all the rest of my estate be equally divided between my brother William and my sister Charity now serving to my mother a widow living out of the benefits of my claim of land south of French broad. And lastly I do constitute my brother William Horn executor and my sister Charity Horn Executrix of this my last will and testament.
