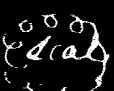
In the name of God Amen this eight day of April sixteen

and ordain this my last will and testament. That is principally
and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God who gave it, And my body I recommend to
the earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the
discretion of my executors nothing doubting but I shall re-

the worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in

Item I give and bequeath unto my sister Charity One sorrel Mare and Colt; also one Mare three years old and all my cattle. Also I do order that all the rest of my estate be equally divided between my brother William and my sister Charity reserving to my mother a debt being out of the benefits of my claim of land south of French Broad. And lastly I do constitute my brother William Horn executor and my sister Charity Horn Executrix of this my last will and testament.
