South of this our Ohio, being now sick and weak in body, but
of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling
unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die I do make and ordain this my last
Will and Testament. That is to say, principally, and first of
all, I give and recommend my Soul into the hand of Almighty
God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth
to be buried, in a decent christian burial, at the discretion

of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the
general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by
the mighty power of God. And as touching such uncer-
tain Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this
life I give and devise and dispose of the same in the following

four self plows and one looking glass, all this I leave to my
wife for life in this world and then divided equal among
my Children. Also I give to my well beloved son Henry, one
Negro boy named Joe and one young horse and one sow, this
being my last Will and Testament to him; Also I give
and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Lucy one Mulatto
girl named Easter, and one half dozen pewter plates, and one
bason and one pewter dish. This also I give to my beloved son
Robert one hundred Acres of Land lying on Tennessee river, two
sows and one mare. This also I give to my well beloved son
John one hundred Acres of Land lying on the Tennessee
joining the same tract, and two Sows. This also leaving
Elizabeth and Sarah and Mary two negro girls and two
feather beds and furniture this to be equally divided between
the three. This also the Negro boy named Ben. and the land
