James Walker of Jefferson County and State of Tennessee being weak in body; but of sound Judgment, and good understanding (Blessed be God) Do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife, whatever and all the Stock now belonging to me, together with the house furniture (not otherwise disposed of in this will) to be at her disposal. - I further give unto my dear wife Fanny Walker, during her natural life, this house in which I now dwell, and plantation, and tract of land in which I now live. - I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Walker this tract of land in which I now live to be his at the decease of my dear wife allowing my Executors of the said will and Testament, to cause the said tract of land to be valued by three disinterested men, the names of whom, that my son Thomas Walker, shall pay to each of my said youngest sons, John Walker, James Walker, Jeremiah Walker and William Cannon Walker one fifth part of the aforementioned value, after deducting therefrom his expense and trouble for securing a title

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I give and bequeath unto my Daughters Franky Walker, Susannah Walker, Elizabeth Elam Walker and

Patsy Cannon Walker one Feather Bed and spinning wheel each to be paid to them as they come of age. — I further give and bequeath unto my son John Walker all that part of my Father's Estate left on by his last will and Testament made in Goochland County the tenth day of May 1794.

And I do hereby make and ordain my dear wife Fanny Walker and Thomas Cannon Executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said James Walker have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of May one thousand eight hundred and one
