weak in body, but sound in mind and memory
knowing the mortality of my body, do make and
ordain this my last will and Testament in writing
My Principally and first of all I would recommend my soul
to God who gave it, in hope of acceptance in and for the
sake of Jesus Christ my Redeemer; my body I recommend
to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner not doubting
but to receive the same again at the resurrection by the
Almighty power of God in Christ my Redeemer.

And as for such worldly good as the Lord has given me
in this life I give bequeath and dispose of in the follow-
ing manner; First I will and desire that all my just
and lawful debts be paid and discharged.

First I bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Corbet her
living moderate on the plantation whilst she remains a
widow & one child's part of the personal Estate.

Secondly. I bequeath to my son James all the lands
I do now possess & said James Corbet is to pay to his
Sisters a twenty five pound horse as they come of age
I will that they all live on the Plantation till they all
be raised; and I will to my s^r son James Corbet my gear-
-ling coll, that is his part of the personal Estate.

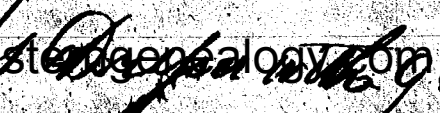
I constitute, make & ordain my beloved wife and

July 13th 1798. First. Three head of Horses. Twelve
head of cattle. Fourteen head of Sheep. Nineteen head
of Hogs. 1 Loom and furniture. 3 Beds and furniture
3 Pots and one pew  Pewter plates
& 7 Basins, one dish 8 Cups and Saucers with one Tea
pot six chairs five pairs and one bucket. Three ploughs
two hoes two axes one grubbing hoe one hammer two pairs
of drawing chains one Log-chain one shot Gun one look-
ing glass 13 Books two spinning wheels one Churn Table
two mans. Saddles two bridles one hand saw two bags
two Churns one washing tub one barrel two Kegs
three Buck-hives - one Iron crock two iron wedges
