

I know all men by these presents that I

to mind the uncertainty of human life
and knowing that it is appointed unto all
men once to die. do make and ordain
this my last will & Testament in the
manner & form following Viz

First of all I recommend my soul to

buried at the discretion of my relations
and friends - and as touching such worldly
estate as it hath pleased God to bless me
with, after payment of my just debts
and funeral charges, I dispose thereof
in the following manner -

I hereby give and bequeath unto Mary
my dearly beloved wife the one third of my
estate both real and personal & her part of
the land be so as to take in the house that
we now live in also barn & other out
houses for her own proper use during her
lifetime or while she remains my widow
as for my son Joseph I think he has got his
share in a certain sum of money that I
gave him which was in Pennsylvania - I
also will that my daughter Ann have two
Cows. and I also give to my two sons

John & Isaac fifty dollars each I also will and bequeath the remainder of my estate both real & Personal together with the widows part of land after her death to be equally divided between my three sons and six daughters Namely Thomas Saint George Mary Mariah Margary Margaret Prudence and Charity - I also constitute my two sons John & Isaac Coppock to execute this my last will and Testament in witness where of I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of the first month in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred, signed sealed Published Pronounced and delivered by the said Thomas Coppock as his last will and testament
