1st I give unto my beloved wife, Mary the Furniture of my house two Beds executed and all my stock of every kind (except one sow & man and calf, and also one Negro Woman named Nancy, to her and her heirs begotten by me forever, And the farm on which I now live during her widowhood together with my farming utensils during said term.

Item 2nd I give unto my Daughter Mary Gills and a Negro Woman named Sal, which she has now in possession, also the sum of Ten Dollars —

Item the 3rd I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Jones the sum of Ten Dollars

Item the 4th I give unto my son Dudley a Negro boy named Jacob now in his possession and one Dollar

Tennessee being in the perfect exercise of my Reason
do make this Division of my estate, to wit,

1st I give unto my beloved wife, Mary the Furniture

two Beds, excised and all my stock of every kind
(except one sow, a mare and calf, and also one Negro
Woman named Nance, to her and her heirs begotten
by me forever, And the farm on which I now live
during her widowhood, together with my farming
Instruments during said term.

Item 2nd I give unto my Daughter Mary Gills one
Negro Woman named Sal, which she has now in
possession, also the sum of ten Dollars.

Item the 3rd I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth
Jones the sum of Ten Dollars.

Item the 4th I give unto my son Dudley one Negro
boy named Jacob now in his possession and one Dollar.

Item the 5th I give unto my two sons William and
Reed a line of land lying on the west side of Moberg
Creek, to be Equally divided by an East and

West line, and I also give unto my son Reed
all my land lying on the East side of Mosey Creek.
and in the Division of the land on the west side of
Mosey Creek my son William to have the lower end
to them and their heirs forever

Item 6th I give unto my son William one Negro boy
named Dick & I also give unto my son William
one bed and furniture

Item 7th I give unto my son Reed one Negro boy
named Tom and some mail and a bit riding gear
and furniture

Item 8th I give my son Hopkins one Negro boy named
Sandy

Item 9th I give my son James one Negro girl named
Lucy

Item 10th I give my daughter Hannah one Negro girl
named Rachel

The remainder of my estate after paying my Just debts
to be equally divided amongst all my children. Lastly I
appoint my wife Executrix, and my son William Exec
utor of this my last will and Testament Signed this
19th day of December 1864
