

No. 111 of Michael Slinn's Deed

State of Tennessee

Johnson County

I Michael Slinn do make and publish

This as my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void
all other wills by me at any time made. First I direct that all my
debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money
that I may die possessed of, or may first come in to the hands of any
heirs. Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy
Slinn my house and plantation or as much thereof as she may
need during her natural life or widow hood, with a wagon
and horses, and farming tools sufficient to carry on the farm
(thirdly) I also bequeath to my wife all my debts that I have
coming to me, when they are collected to dispose of the money
as she may think proper. (fourthly) at the death of my wife I
bequeath to my four youngest sons to wit David, Andrew, to
Andrew and Martin all my undivided lands for them to divi-
de as they may think proper, and my desire is that they woud
all stay on the farm and work to gether, and take care of their
mother. (fifthly) I bequeath to my daughter a horse saddle and
bridle and ~~two sheep and hogs~~ and house hold furniture
sufficient for house keeping. (Sixthly and lastly) I bequeath
to William Gambrell the fifty acres of land where he
now lives for five years or as long as he may wish to stay there
to have free and peaceable possession. In witness whereof I
do to this my last will set my hand and seal this 14th day
of May the 14th 1846
