monies made Oath that they saw the said Enos Woods sign, seal, publish, and
the same to be his last Will and Testament, and that he was at the time of his signing
the same of sound and perfect mind and memory to the best of their belief
and they saw Samuel Woods sign his name as a concuring witness to
which will is ordered to be Recorded and is in these words to wit,

In the Name of God Amen the Nineteenth day of November in the year of our Lord 1805 I Enos Woods of the State of Pennsylvania and County of Perry being very poor and weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same, I of the
best mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all
to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that say, Beginning with
first of all, I give and Recommend my Soul unto the hands of God that gave it me
concerning my Body I command it to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner
the disposition of my Estate nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection when
in everlasting happiness in the life to come through the merit and mediation of my

dear

 Redeemer Jesus Christ, and as touching my Church worldly estate I command it to be left after my
God to help me in this life, I give these Disposals of the same in manner and of
Myself that is to say,

In the first place I give and bequeath unto my
Lands wife Mary Woods all my good and chattels(s) all my Household goods
working Tools and Stock with all my moveable Estate except my large field lying
given to the Peoply of Perry portion of my land to cultivate and improve hereby
for ever to support and bring up her son Mason Woods till the time he comes of age to aid him
in his said land or leaving his first State of Wicklowish, Ireland I command
