The Last Will and Testament of James Spence deceased was produced to Court for probate John Ingram, John McMillan & Alexander Menning the subscribing witnesses thereto made Oath that they saw the said James Spence sign seal & read him pronounced and declared the same to be his Last Will and Testament, and that he was at the time of publishing the same of sound and disposing mind & memory to the Best of their Knowledge which will is ordered to be recorded, be in these Words.

"In the name of God, Amen. I James Spence of the County of Knox and State of Tennessee being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and declare this my Last Will Testament (viz) principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul to the hand of Almighty God that gave it to me and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the Direction of my Executors, namely Alexander McMillan of the aforesaid County State, and as touching my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give and Dispose of the same in the following Manner, to-wit—

First I give and bequeath to my loving wife Rebecca Spence two Hundred acres of Land the Plantations whereon I now live and one yellow Bay mare three years old and all my stock of sheep, and four cows, fifteen head of hogs of her own choice out of my flock and all the Household Furniture and a Negro Woman named Sarah and all the Wool, Flax and Cotton, bees hives, that I now have, But the Land above mentioned and Negro Woman is to be hers only during her life time or life widowhood, and then the Land is to fall to my youngest son James and the Negro Woman to be sold and her price to be divided among my Children and the balance of her part of my Estate is at her death to be divided at her discretion among my Children.

I also allow to her all my Farming Tools belonging to the Plantation & a cutting box & cutting knife.

Next I give to my son William two hundred acres of Land lying on the head of Donaglas' creek and one bay horse distinguished by the name of buck or one equal in value to him and a good saddle and bridle and a rifle gun that he now claims when he comes of age—

Also I give to my daughter Mary and my daughter Elizabeth and my daughter Jane each One Hundred Dollars and One bed & furniture a piece to them when they marry or come of age— Also I give to my son James in addition to the Land before mentioned one horse saddle and bridle equal in value to One hundred and twenty five Dollars when he comes of age— My

Will further is that my Plantations on which I live containing two hundred acres more or less after the said Midkay bargains lease is out, which will be out next March come, two years that it be rented out until my youngest child comes of age and the rent to be equally divided amongst my children and then to be sold and the price to be divided in the same manner— and if any of my Children should die before they come of age and not leaving any legitimate living children then their part of my estate is to be equally divided amongst their living brothers and sisters and the balance of my property to be sold at Auction and my debts to be paid out of the same and the remainder together with the debts owing to me after my daughters have got their parts paid to them already (if any) there is remaining it is to be equally divided amongst my Children and my wife is to give to my Children and my wife is to give to my Children a decent english education out of her part of my estate (that is) they are to be taught to read and write in a decent manner and the Boys to be taught the common parts of Arithmetic—

And I do hereby utterly disavow, revoke and disannul all and every other former, wills Testaments legacies and bequests by me in any wise before named, written and bequeathed - ratifying allowing and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament.
