George Wilson Guardian of Joshua Grant reports to the Court of Union County at the January Session 1815 that a Negro girl slave the property of his Ward by deed of gift from his Grandfather came to his possession on the 22^d day of August last, and after public notice was by him laid out for sale to the highest bidder for the sum of fifteen dollars on the 25th day of December, that said slave named Jenny was afterwards hired the 30th day of December to Mrs. Sally Kimbrell for the sum of twenty five cents, neither of which Jenny has the said Guardian as yet collected. That on the 2^d day of January inst. said slave was again hired by public outcry to Thomas R. Murray until the first day of January 1816 for the sum of five dollars.
