William Bell

The last Will and Testament of William Bell deceased with the Codicil thereto annexed was produced to Court for probate whereupon Joseph Love one of the subscribing Witnesses to said Will made oath that he saw William Bell sign seal and heard him pronounce and declare the same to be his last Will and Testament and that he was at that time of sound disposing mind and memory according to the best of his knowledge and belief and that he saw Archibald Bell and Elizabeth Bell sign their names or concerning evidences - And Robert Bell and Thomas Bell witnesses to said Codicil made oath that they saw the said William Bell sign seal and heard him pronounce the like to be his last Will and Testament and that he was at the time of publishing the same of sound disposing mind and memory to the best of their knowledge and belief which Will and Codicil is ordered to be recorded and is in these words to wit,

"In the name of God amen, I William Bell of Knox County being weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make this my last Will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hand of almighty God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian Burial, at the discretion of my executors. Nothing doubting but at the general re junction I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased god to bless

me within this life, I give devise and dispose the same in the following manner and form to my Give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Beck Bell, two hundred and fifty acres of Land of the Lower end of my tract, including all the movement whereon I now live, during her natural life, and at her Death to be equal Divided between my two sons, Robert Bell and John Bell and I give and bequeath to my said Wife, her slaves, to wit, Walker, a man, Delee, a Woman & a boy, Gim, a girl and all and singular m<sup>r</sup> of all kinds, and all my household furniture paying all my Lawful debts, Out of my estate household Furniture, During her natural life should she marry, Then in that Case, the and property, to be valued by three good chuse men chosen by the Executors, and she may true to keep the property on any part it provided her husband will give Bond and sufficient security to be approved of by executors, for the delivery of the said property on the payment of the said valuation at her death and should her husband fail to give Bond as said, then the property to be sold at a credit discretion of the Executors, and should the female negroes Delee and Gim, have any share to be Disposed of in the following manner I also give and bequeath unto my dutiful Daughter Dolly & Love one negro Girl named Malinda value of one hundred and fifty Dollars, which has now in her possession. And I also give an bequeath unto my dutiful son, Thomas, two hundred and twenty five acres of land being half of the upper end of the hole tract, which end is to be divided by a straight line Begining hundred rods from the original line of the hundred acre survey on a line that is run

the same, thence eastwardly a straight line him a upper line of the original survey so as to include of improvements wherein he now lives, and also a hand boy named Jesse, of the value of two hundred Dollars which he has now in possession. And I also give bequeath unto my dutiful Daughter Nancy Everette, a negro boy named George, of the value of two hundred Dollars which she has now in possession. And I also give and bequeath unto my dutiful son Rebekah Bell, a negro boy named Anderson and also one hundred and twenty five acres of land to be laid off adjoining that tract which is given to them as Bell, and above a line which is run thro' the five hundred acre tract, which negro boy & land is to be and remain in the possession of my Wife during her natural life if she does not think proper to give them to him sooner, and if she does the Negro boy is to be valued by three good men proportionally to the value of the others here before valued. And I also give and bequeath unto my dutiful children Elizabeth Bell, Robert Bell & her little Son John Bell & the other one which my wife is now acquainted with a young negro of the value of two hundred Dollars, which should the aforesaid female negroes Delee and Gim, have any or two hundred Dollars each, to be paid out of the property at the decease of my wife should there be that much made if not to be paid up to those of my children which has got negroes of the highest value, so as to make all my children have an equal value of my estate of negroes and of Cash and it is my wish and meaning that if any of my children should get or that has got, a young negro that is not of the value of two hundred Dollars that should be made up to that value, should there be property enough to do so, & should there be any more than doing th<sup>t</sup>, that it is to be divided equally between all my children, and also that my aged Mother shall be decently supported during her life but

in that part which is hereby Devised to my Wife, I do likewise appoint, Constitute, and ordain  
mas Bell, Robert Bell & Joseph Love my Execu-  
tors to this my last Will and Testament - In
