The last Will and Testament of William Bell deceased with the Codicil thereto annexed was produced to Court for probate. Whereupon Joseph Love one of the subscribing Witnesses to said Will made oath that he saw William Bell sign seal and heard him pronounce and Declare the same to be his last Will and Testament and that he was at that time of sound disposing mind and memory according to the best of his knowledge and belief and that he saw Michael Bell and Elizabeth Bell sign their names as concurring evidences. And Robert Bell and Thomas Bell witnesses to said Codicil made oath that they saw the said William Bell sign seal and heard him pronounce seal and Declare the same to be a Codicil to his last Will and Testament and that he was at the time of publishing the same of sound disposing mind and memory to the best of their knowledge and belief which Will and Codicil is now to be recorded and is in their words to wit:

"In the name of God amen, I William Bell of Knox County being weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, Thanks be given unto God, Calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men to Die, Do make this my last Will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian Burial, at the discretion of my Executors. Nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, And as touching such worldly estate, wherewith it has pleased God to bless me,
