At October Sessions 1816 On the motion of Isabella Patton widow of Robert Patton deceased, it is ordered that Thomas Gillespie, Penneack Jack and Joseph Moore, being first sworn, do impartially set apart so much of the crop and provisions on hand as may be

necessary to support said widow and her family one year from the death of her said husband according to the act of Assembly in such case made and provided and report to the next court their proceedings thereon.

And at January Sessions 1817 the commissioners appointed to set apart a year support to the widow and family of Robert Patton deceased do make up as follows.

We the undersigned being appointed by the court of Knox county to allot to Isabella Patton widow and wife of Robert Patton deceased maintenance for her self and family for one year from the decease of her husband and being first sworn we do allot to said widow one hundred and fifty bushels of corn being the crop of corn that was on the ground at the decease of her husband which crop was estimated at two hundred and fifty bushels making in the whole four hundred bushels and the aforesaid one hundred and fifty bushels is rated by us at two shillings per bushel. We allot to her five hundred weight of pork which will be purchased at four dollars per lb. besides the hog mentioned in the inventory that was not sold. We also allow her all the garden vegetables that were growing on the plantation at the time of her husband's decease also all the chickens, the flax and cotton or yarn that was on hand and twenty five dollars in cash for purchase of salt leather and such articles.
