3^d I Will and bequeath unto my daughter Peggy and her lawful issue one Dollar out of my estate -

4th I Will & bequeath to my son John Monday one dollar out of my estate -

5th I Will & bequeath to my son William Monday or his lawful issue one Dollar -

6th I Will and bequeath to my daughter Mary Ann and her lawful issue one Dollar out of my estate -

7th I Will and bequeath to my son Joshua Monday and his lawful issue one Dollar out of my estate -

My dear, P. S. Mundy 1818

8th I will and bequeath to my son Robert Munday and his lawful issue ~~all~~ ^{the} ~~land~~ ^{part} of my land from George Landon with the line, that lies on the East side of the Creek to the first crop fence, below the old Orchard, and with so far as out to the Eastern line including the benefit of the one half of the Saw Mill with him being at one half of the expense of keeping or sawmill in repair, - and likewise one negro woman named Beth, on by the said Robert is to pay fifty Dollars to Mary Ann, wife of the said Mary Ann, money really stand in need thereof for the support of her family -

9th I will and bequeath to my son Samuel Munday all the rest of Plantation the Balance the sawmill, including three Melatto, Slaves, two or three Hens, and the land, with all the Stock Hogs, and Geese and all the Farming Utensils and every other part of my estate not otherwise bequeathed, to be his only at the decease of my beloved Wife - or at her intermarriage, and the said Samuel Munday is to pay unto my son William Munday fifty dollars in six months after he the said Samuel Munday gets in full possession of this my bequeathment to him - And I do hereby disannul all former Wills and Testaments here before made, admitting this to be my last Will Testament - And lastly, I do hereby constitute appoint and ordain my son and truly friend Robert Munday to be my Executor of this my last Will and Testament -
