

April Session 1820

In the name of God amos. I James Miller of the County of Knox and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory taking into view the uncertainty of life do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament as follows to wit:

I give and Bequeath unto my Brother Samuel Miller the Debt which he owes me and I charge my Executors to show to him his obligation Dated 29th day of September 1796 for securing to me that Debt amounting to six hundred and eighty four Dollars.

I give and Bequeath unto my niece Jane Miller Daughter of my Brother Samuel one negro girl named Fanny to be delivered to her by my Executors so soon as they are properly qualified.

I give and Bequeath unto Nancy wife of Robert Miller Daughter of my Brother Samuel one negro girl named Mary to be delivered to her by my Executors so soon as they are properly qualified.

I give and Bequeath unto my sister Martha of the Kingdom of Ireland one thousand Dollars if she is alive if not I bequeath that sum to her Children to be equally divided amongst them.

I give and Bequeath unto my sister Elizabeth of the Kingdom of Ireland one thousand Dollars if she is alive

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if not I bequeath that sum to her Children to be equally divided amongst them.

I give and Bequeath unto my Sister Jane of the Kingdom of Ireland only Daughter of my sister Nancy Dunmore one thousand Dollars if she is alive if not I bequeath that sum to her Children to be equally divided amongst them.

I give and Bequeath unto my Cousin Nancy Miller Daughter of Robert Miller near Pittsburg Pennsylvania five hundred Dollars.

I give and Bequeath unto my Brother John Miller one hundred Dollars if he should be alive at the time of the probate of this will if not that sum to be equally divided amongst his legal heirs & Representatives.

I give and Bequeath unto my nephew James Miller son of my Brother Samuel Miller five hundred Dollars to be paid to him by the persons or persons holding my real property in manner herein after stated when he attains the age of twenty years and in case he should die previous to his attaining that age that sum is to be equally divided amongst his Brothers sisters when arrived at age.

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I give and Bequeath the sum of five hundred Dollars to be equally divided amongst the other Children of my Brother Samuel who may be alive at the time of the Probate of this will to be Paid to them in equal Dividends when they severally become of age and in case any should die previous to their attaining that age then their share and share to be equally divided amongst the Survivors of them

I give and Bequeath to each of my Executors herein after named if they both undertake the execution of this my last will & Testament two hundred Dollars with a sum or sums equal to any expenses they may incur in defending my estate in Law or equity or in their attentions to the management of my estate until it is finally settled and in case either should refuse to act, then the one who undertakes & is qualified shall have all herein bequeathed to both

And as to the residue of my Negroes and all my real property of every Description It is my will & Desire that my Executors immediately after the Probate of this will appoint three good and substantial freeholders of Knox County to appraise or value the same at a reasonable Cash Price which appraisement is to be filed on

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Recorded in the Clerk's Office of Knox County That immediately after such appraisements being made It is my will & I do hereby Bequeath all the said Negroes & real property of every Description to John R. Gamble of Knoxville by him to be held occupied passed & enjoyed from the time of Two years from the Probate of my will & at the expiration of That time It is my wish that the said John R. Gamble should cause to be made an equal Dividend of said Negroes & real property appraised as aforesaid among the Children of my Sister Jane Gray of the Kingdom of Ireland if they the said Children or their heirs (as the Law requires so whether this Period of Two years as aforesaid remove into the United States & become Citizens thereof by taking the Oath or Oaths pointed out by the Laws of the United States to entitle them to the Rights of Citizenship. The partition or Dividends of the property as aforesaid to be made by Petition to the County Court as in other cases and the said John R. Gamble his Executors or administrators is hereby requested & authorized to carry the same into effect with to carry the same and Negroes to the several Children

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of my sister Jane as aforesaid agreeable
to the partition and attachment not in
any manner making himself liable for
any Defect or Defects in the title
to the Conveyance he executed as
they may, But if they the said Children
of my sister Jane should fail to
remain in the United States and become
Citizens within the two years as aforesaid
I shall then and the aforesaid Negroes
and real ~~property~~ Estates as aforesaid
shall be held occupied possessed
& Enjoyed by the said John N.
Gambel his heirs & assigns for ever
subject to the payment of the amount
of the appraisements aforesaid in such
manner and at such times as are
herein after pointed out

And it is my will that my
Executors as soon as practicable sell
all the residue of my personal Estate
of what ever kind it may be to
specific sale according to Law at
Twelve months Credit the purchaser
giving Bond with security approved
of by my Executors and that the pro-
ceeds of such sale together with the
money I may possess & the debts due
to me at the time of my death be
applied first to pay my just debts
& the residue to the payment of the

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Bequests to my sister Martha and
Elizabeth my Niece Jane Daughter of
my sister Henry & Cassius Hancy as for
as the same may extend in proportion to
the amount of such bequests But none
of said Legacies to be paid or paid
under three years from the time of the
probate of this will

And it is my will that John
N. Gambel as the Children of my
sister Jane possessing my Negroes and
real property as the same may be should
pay all the residue of the Bequests in
this my Last will & Testament after
the application of the Cash Debts &
proceeds of my Personal Estate as
aforesaid my Executors retaining the
sums Bequeathed to them or the
survivor of them with the incomes
aforesaid in the following manner to wit
to my sister Martha & Elizabeth in
five years from the probate of this
will to my Niece Jane Daughter
of my sister Henry & Cassius Hancy
in six years from the probate of this
will to my Brother John in seven
years from the probate of this will
to my Brother Robert the first
payment to be made him on the
first Day of January next after
three years from the probate of
this will

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I have Annually during his life and the other Legacies to the Surviving Legacies at the times herein before mentioned And if the proceeds of my Personal Estate except Negroes Cash and handys & Debts Due to me after paying my Debts should not be sufficient to pay such Legacies so may become Due with in the Term of Two years as aforesaid and those Legacies be called and previous to the expiration of that time it is my wish that they should be discharged by John N. Gamble And if my said Sons Children as aforesaid should comply with the before mentioned requestions so as to authorize them to receive my property from the said John N. Gamble as his Executors or administrators The Commissions appointed as aforesaid for the purpose of Dividing the same are hereby vested with full power and Authority to give and each Divid. and an equal or greater proportion of the other Legacies that may at that time be Due or that may hereafter become Due or that may have been paid by the said John N. Gamble agreeable to the quantity and quality of said Dividends And such Legacy or proportion thereof as the said may be shall be a Lien and said

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Dividends and the said John N. Gamble his Executors or administrators in making Carveyances or Bills of sale for said Lands & Negroes is requested to attend to & Charge such Sums or Sums of Money as may be assigned to each share on the fore of such Carveyances or Bills of sale as the case may be provided the said John N. Gamble is not bound to make such titles nor in any manner alienate the property out of himself until he is paid or properly secured in all such Sums or Sums of Money as he may have Legally advanced or paid for Legacies (Due previous to that with Interest on the amount thereof from the Date of such payments) and if the Children of my sister Jane Gray should fail to comply so that the property becomes jointly vested in John N. Gamble then the said John N. Gamble after paying the Legacies herein before Bequeathed or Retaining in his hand a sufficient sum of money to pay them or they severally become Due shall pay the Balance or Residue of said Appraisment or Valuation of said Lands and Negroes to the said Children of my sister Jane in equal Dividends as they respectively become of age provided that if there be more than one of said Children of age at the time of the first application the said John N. Gamble is not bound to pay them all upon such application but shall

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Pay the Estate first and then pay the
Others annually their dividends agreeable
to their age then the others to receive
their Dividends as they become of age

As to the Lands in dispute between
myself and the heirs of Hottelings &
J. W. Clark if I should eventually
be successful in gaining a Decree it
is my wish that those Lands be
Purchased or sold by the said John W.
Gamble upon the same Principles
that he is to hold my other property
And if the Children of my Sister
Jane should fail come into the
United States & become Citizens so
aforesaid within the Ten years so as
to become entitled to receive the said
Property from John W. Gamble or
within two years thereafter do not appear
to receive from the said John W. Gamble
any of their Dividends of the amount of
the appraisement then it is my will
that the amount of said appraisement
be Divided into Three equal Dividends
Between the Children of my Sister
Martha & Elizabeth & the Children
of my Sister Jane & daughter of my
Sister Nancy - and so as to pay to
the Children of said families in equal
Dividends by the said John W. Gamble
his Executors or administrators
annually to those that may be of age

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Agreeable to their ages until all that have
arrived of age receive their Dividends in
the same manner that he was to have
paid the same to my Sister James Child-
ren & then to the others as they may
eventually arrive at age

Lastly I do hereby nominate
Constitute and appoint Charles M. Calhoun
and John W. Gamble Executors of the
my Last will & Testament hereby revoking
all other wills by me heretofore made
& Ratifying this & no other to be
my Last will & Testament
