And as for what I give to my son John Mowd, all of which property she shall have while my children, but should she marry it shall immediately thereafter revert to my son John Mowd

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except two cows and two sheep - I also wish it to be understood, that after the ^{death} ~~death~~ of my wife Sarah, all her property shall fall to my son John Mowd or his heirs, all my sheep stock shall be wintered except with grain, by my son John Mowd, shall have fifty five bushels of corn, and five bushels of wheat yearly for her support, the same shall be delivered to her and taxable by my son John Mowd so much of the grain as shall be necessary for family use my son shall have ground and delivered to her during my widowhood. It is further my Will that Joseph Gilbreath shall within twelve months after my decease pay to Robert and Ann Houston one hundred dollars also that John Gilbreath shall pay to Alexander and Sam Gilbreath one hundred dollars, at the same period of twelve months after my decease.

Further It is my Will that my four sons, Samuel, Thomas, John and William shall pay to Joseph Gilbreath fifty dollars, and that Thomas and William pay five dollars each to my grand children, Belana, John, and Mary Jane, the descendants of my son James Gilbreath.
