children, and to have and enjoy
my house and plantation with all
and every privilege, all the above
named property during her natural
life - Again I will my man Sam,
and my man Jacob, and my woman
Hannah, and Hannah's children, to my
beloved wife during her life, which land
and other property to be equally divided
between my children at her death -
My boy Dick & his woman Eliza and
her children, to be taken and sold by
my Executor as they may think best
for the interest of my Estate, and the re-
sidue of my Cattle to be sold, my debts
to be collected, the money arising from

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the sales, of my Negroes, cattle &c - to be
appropriated to the payment of my
debts, if there is any, more or less, to be
for the use of schooling & educating my
children, If there is yet a residue
remaining in the hands of my Executor
the same must be equally divided
between my dear children equally -
I have an interest in two negroes namely
Nomed & her son Elliott, and I leave
an interest in two hundred acres of land
which was and the property of my dear
and beloved mother, I relinquish my in-
terest in the above property to my dear
mother for her use during her life
at her death the above named ~~to~~
interest, be the same man or wife to
be equally divided between my
dear sisters -

one horse she mother saddle at her death
and bridle & Bed and bedstead & Clothing
Trunk & Cow & Calf—

Seventhly I give to my beloved son John
one horse saddle bridle Cow half & Bed & Clothing
Eighty, I give to my beloved son Joseph one
horse saddle bridle Cow half & Bed & Clothing
Ninthly I give to my beloved daughter Sarah
one horse saddle & bridle, Bed & Clothing
Cow Half & Calf—

Tenthly I want all my family that is
now with me, to live on the plantation
while living and to get their necessaries

my life, but should she marry
it shall immediately revert to my son John Moore.

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except two Cows and two bed - & also with
it to be understood, that after the death
of my wife Sarah, all her property
shall fall to my son John Moore
as his share, all my other stock shall
be wintered except with grain, by my
son John Moore, who shall have fifty
five bushels of Corn, and five
bushels of wheat yearly for his
support, the same shall be delivered
to him during and terminable by my
son John Moore so much of the
grain as shall be necessary for
family use my son shall have
ground and occasioned to live on
his own hand
