sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly substance, as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and bequeath the same in manner following, that is to say It is my Will and I do order that all my just debts and financial charges be paid & satisfied, Item, I give and bequeath unto Ruth Peterson, my dearly beloved wife during her lifetime, the sole of my estate of lands which my I now live, likewise two mares, ten head of sheep and all the stock of hogs and her share of ten head of cattle out of my stock, and all the household furniture, — kitchen furniture also all the farming Utensils & waggons & gear, also the wheat fan, — Item I give unto my well beloved son Joseph, one Negro boy name Ned, Item I give unto my well beloved son Martin, one negro boy name Dicko also one boy name Dicko — Item I give unto my well beloved son William, one Negro boy name Jacob, also one fowl name Cuff, — Item I give unto my well beloved son Isaac one Negro boy name Lewis, also one yearling cote name Tom, Item I give unto my well beloved son James one Mule cote boy name Ben also his former claim of three head of sheep and he is to have one fowl cote come of filly in his possession at my decease, I give unto my beloved son Matthew one Negro woman name Rose, also one Negro boy name Ganette, also he is to have one fowl cote come of the young ones

I do hereby give unto my well beloved son John, the half of all my land estate, at the decease of my Wife, - Item I give unto my well beloved son Andrew, the half of all my land estate at the decease of my Wife, the land estate is to be divided between the two last mentioned Sons, so as to make it equal in Value, if either of the aforesaid Sons John & Andrew should decease before they are of the age of twenty one years, the Surviving one is to have the hole of the deceased's estate; also Andrew is to have one Negro boy named Adony, also he is to have my saddle; - Item it is my Will that as much of the present Debt, be taken as will support the Family, the present Year, Item it is my Will if there should not be money enough, to pay all my just debts, that the above named Negro shall be hired out, by my Executors until all my just debts are paid - And lastly I do here by constitute and appoint my beloved Sons Martin & William with my trusty friend William Sawyers Executor of this my last Will & Testament, hereby revoking all other former Wills or Testaments, by me heretofore made, - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the twenty second day of June in the year of our Lord 1818,
