Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my beloved son M. J. Murphy at the death of my wife, or at the expiration of her undivided, my negro boy named a Slave for life to him and to his heirs forever.

Fifthly, I give and bequeath to my beloved son M. J. Murphy at the death of my wife or at her death my negro boy named Sandy to him and to his heirs forever.

Sixthly, I give and bequeath to my beloved son Samuel R. Murphy at the death of my wife or at her death my negro girl Ellen Catherine to him and to his heirs forever.

Seventhly, It is my will and desire and I hereby bequeath the sum of one increase of my negro girl Betty a Slave, before the death or marriage of my wife to be equally divided between my four before named children. I further give and bequeath my tract

of Land wherein I now reside to be equally divided at the death or marriage of my wife between my four above mentioned children.

Lastly, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Frances J. Murphy my negro Slave Dier to her and heirs forever, and I nominate constitute and appoint my beloved wife the said Frances J. Murphy sole executrix of this my last will and testament and will and desire is that my said Executrix shall not be required to give security.

In Witness whereof, I Joseph Murphy, the said testator, have to this, my last will and testament, written on one sheet of paper, set my hand and seal this 31st day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three.
