{The contentious character of the claims of this
 together with his refusal, and his being a resident
 of Mississippi subjects it to the uncertainties of
 litigation since it is elapsed as doubtful}

A claim now pending in the Supreme Court which
 has been in litigation some thirteen years, judgment
 was originally awarded in the name of Patient
 Finner as guardian in the Circuit Court of Boggs
 County Tennesse, at the October Term 1839 as John
 Hunter & Co in the sum of eight thousand two hundred
 & fourteen Dollars, & 87th cts, John M. Finner succeeded
 Patient Finner as guardian of S. Catterbridge who
 settled infall with his guardian after becoming
 of age, John M. Finner as guardian on the 29th
 April 1841 signed and transferred to R. H. Byrn
 six thousand five hundred dollars part of this
 judgment, and interest for a plantation bought
 of said R. H. Byrn for S. Catterbridge with his
 privily and consent he being then at the age
 to be consulted, and which he retained and
 Catterbridge many and sold to Charles
 B. Finner.

The balance of this judgment and interest
 is due to the said S. Catterbridge who in his
 life time employed A. W. Catteridge Esq as his
 attorney in said suit in the Supreme
 Court, and after the pronouncement of judg-

Cotton to the Supreme Bench - Thus he employs
Milton Brown Esq as his Counsel and attorney
in the prosecution of said claim. The Supreme
Court has decided some of the issues, alleged
as fraud a Sale of the Hunter plantation
has been ordered and made. The party in
possession set up little under an older judgment
hence a train of litigation must ensue.
This claim may therefore be considered
as it was by Sutterbridge prior to his
death as extremely doubtful -
Clear, therefore as a Bad debt
