of the Ripley road said land begins

11th I will & bequeath to my grand daughter Mary S Thornton my spice box my writing table with a door also my trunk that has my name on it the gift of my father

12th In consequence of my having devised to my daughter Mary S Anthony the portions of the Dock tract of land above mentioned she is to will and bequeath to my grand sons William Anthony & Thomas A. Anthony each eight hundred dollars —

13th I will & direct that my servant William Dummerfield go with his wife Jane to my daughter Susan H Thornton and that my daughter Mary S Anthony make a relinquishment of her interest in said slave to the said Susan H Thornton —

14th I will & direct that my servant Henry Lewis go with his wife to my daughter Mary S Anthony and that Susan H Thornton make a relinquishment of her interest in said slave to the said Mary S Anthony

15th I will & bequeath to my executor William Anthony two hundred dollars to be kept by him, to administer to the support of my faithful servant Billy Harrison who is to go with his wife & children

- I will & bequeath to the said William Anthony one horse for his own use
- 16th I will & bequeath to Thomas Smith Anthony Son of William Anthony eight hundred dollars which he is to invest for him as he may think proper
