The last Will and Testament of David Gilleland of
Lauderdale County, State of Tennessee.

Item 1. I give and bequeath to my nephew William Harlan
in trust for the support of himself and his children for and during
the period of his natural life, one tenth part ^{in value} of the ^{twenty five} slaves
which have absconded and are now fugitives from labor
or one tenth part of the compensation thereof if they are never
recovered and compensation thereof should be received,
and the Southern half of my tract of land of 240 acres and 156
pols lying in said County, which I purchased from J. B. Masby
and on his death I give bequeath and devise the same
in fee to such child or children as he, the said William
Harlan may leave him surviving, to take as tenants in
common if more than one --

Item 2. I give, bequeath and devise all the rest and residue
of my ~~estate~~ ^{estate}, real, personal and mixed to my nephews
David G. Thum, Samuel G. Thum, John G. Thum, and George
W. Thum and my nieces Eliza J. Barfield, wife of Ira G.
Barfield, Sarah A. Alston wife of Miles E. Alston, Mary
E. Thum and Susan E. Thum to take the same in fee
as tenants in common

But if either of my last named nephews or nieces should
die in my life time, I give bequeath and devise his or her
share to his or her children as tenants in common, if he or
she leave any child or children him or her surviving --
But if he or she be dying in my life time leave no child
or children him or her surviving, then I give, bequeath and
devise the share of my said nephew or niece so dying in
my life time to my surviving ^{nephews and} ^{nieces} mentioned in this
clause of my Will and to the children of such as may
be dead to take per stirpes

Two Hundred & Eighty Acres more or less along
the South Boundary including the Childers Lease on

Hundred & Twenty five Acres more or less North
of P. I Sutton's tract And there is one Hundred
Acres North of J. P. Parker's tract And some Two
Hundred Acres next to Stacey's then there is between

[6th] George & Frank shall be sold after my death if they are alive & are not disposed of by me previous to my death [7th] My Daughter Elizabeth A. Johnson shall have out of some portion of my Estate Two Hundred & Fifty Dollars in money [8th] Then at the death of my wife Frances Parker if she should live longer than myself And be possessed of the Lands and Negroes & properties above stated which I have left for her use and benefit during her Natural Life then all of said property shall be sold unless a Division of the Negroes or any of the other property can be made of it which is satisfactory to the parties concerned if not then said the Negroes & all the other property shall be sold on such time & terms as may best suit the then existing times And out of the proceeds thereof or out of some other portion of my Estate Valloons A. Jordan's two children if alive shall each have Five Hundred Dollars a piece & if either one is dead the other shall have Five Hundred Dollars & in case they are both be dead then the proceeds shall be divided between J. P. Parker & P. L. Sutton or the children of each
