Last Will of Willis Richardson

I, Willis Richardson of Lawrence County, State of Tennessee, do hereby make Ordain and publish this my last Will and Testament in the form following, to wit; I Will that all my just debts and claims be paid, and I hereby authorize my Executor herein after named, to sell so much of my personal property either at public or private sale, so as to carry out the highest price, as may be necessary to pay off and discharge my just debts as speedily as possible, practically;

Item 1. I give to my beloved wife Margaret Richardson during her natural life or Widowhood, all the balance of my personal and personal property, after paying my debts as aforesaid, to hold use and enjoy for the purpose of raising and covering my younger children, and supporting herself in comfort and decency, I also give to my said wife Margaret, the use and occupation of my tract of Land on which I now live during her natural life or Widowhood, together with the occupation of one two and three years if she thinks proper, and purchase another small farm with the proceeds of said sale that will be made suitable for her, on the account of her taking a little for said purchased place, in the name of my said wife reserving to herself the use of it, during her life with all its debts and property, If my said wife should die, may for my home place, then may be necessary to purchase her a more suitable place, I desire her to loan out the surplus funds in safe hands for the benefit of my heirs;

Item 2. It is my will and desire, that my wife sell my tract of Land upon a credit of one two and three years so soon as times become favorable so as to secure a good price, and loan out the money funds arising from said sale for the benefit of my heirs;

Item 3. If my wife should die, I then give to her, her two full halves of my lands and aches part of my personal property;

Item 4.
