# Wm. Simonson's 86 86

The last Will of Jno. Simonson etc.  
Passed at August, Boston 1840.

I John Simonson of the County of Suffolk and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory, but knowing the uncertainty of this mortal life, do make this my last will and testament, hereby bequeathing all former slaves in my care, and from fellow negroes, to wit: I give to my beloved wife, Jane Simonson, two Negro men, one named Jack and one named Henry, one Negro Boy named Adolphus, and one named Jeffery, two Negro women named Kate and Scane, I also give to my said wife Jane all my flock of horses, cattle, dogs, sheep and my negro Farming tools, and house hold and kitchen furniture, I also will and bequeath to my wife Jane during her natural life my Negro boy Peter and my Realty tract of Land whereon I now live, which is a small tract which I purchased of King's William 3, and my daughter among the said Negros, to wit:

Second - I will and bequeath to my daughter Mary during two Negroes which she now has in her possession, one girl named Linda and one boy named Stephen, also one hundred dollars in cash,

Third - I give to my son William Simonson my interest, being one thousand dollars (as evidenced by a receipt on 8th of Feb. Simonson dated May 15 1834, in his Negroes, to wit: the property of Martin Gardner in trust for my daughter Sarah Gardner, and her children and I do give and bequeath my said son William to execute, said trust, by giving to my daughter Sarah the use of said Negroes during her life, and at her death, to divide them or their proceeds, among all of Sarah's children equally,

Fourth - I will and bequeath to my son Gilbert M. Simonson my Negro boy Joe if ~~he is not sold by me~~ if I sell him I give to him his said boy's price in cash,

Fifth - I give to my son William my Negro boy Peter at the death of my wife Jane,

Sixth - I will and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Davis of Jane Bowdler my Negro girl Niny, each one equal share of her, and I direct my executors to value said girl Niny and give to Sarah the said girl Niny by her paying to Sarah half the valuation of said girl,

Seventh - I will and bequeath to my daughter Palmyra Henderson of Adair & Buchanan, my Negro boy Bob each one half, equal share to be taken by my executors, and I direct to have the boy, by paying to Palmyra half his value, I also give to my daughter Palmyra a horse worth fifty or sixty dollars, or twenty dollars in cash in lieu of said horse,

Eighth - I will and bequeath to my daughter Margaret M. Simonson a Negro boy named Henry, and a piece of Land called my Redrow, which lies between William, the old line and Rufus G. Henderson's line west of the 1/2 part of Henderson, I also give to my daughter Margaret M. Simonson, my Realty tract of Land at her Mother's death, say all the land that her mother has a life time estate in;

North - I will and bequeath to my daughter Rodan half the estate  
one hundred dollars in cash,  
South, to wit - After paying my debts of funeral expenses and the  
money lying here in special - I will and bequeath to my wife  
Sam all the balance of my effects and residue of my estate of  
whatsoever description, Money, Notes, and all other matters of things  
I possess and appoint my two sons Gilbert W. Simonson  
and William Simonson and my son - son William Davis  
to see into this my last will and testament,  
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed  
my seal this first day of March 1835

I, William Reynolds being weak in body though  
Lawrence County, I am in mind, do in the name of god Amen,  
make this my last will and last testament, After my debts are paid, I do  
and bequeath to my beloved wife Candice, all my lands, Tenements, house hold  
furniture together, with all my ~~stock~~ <sup>stock</sup> of horses, cattle, pigs, &c.  
farming utensils, also all my money to her and to her during her natural  
life or widowhood, and when she dies or marries that all my property  
be divided equally between my legal heirs. I wish more of my wish that  
my son in-law, Edward Brandon, debts shall be paid out of my money  
and that he have a sufficiency of it to defray his expenses in moving to  
where my family is and that he live with them as one of my family, and that  
what he expends be considered as a part of his legacy from my estate,  
Furthermore I take the said wife, in the possession of Edward Brandon and

In the name of god Amen; I Jeremiah Bently of said State and County, being of sound mind and memory but at the same time sensible of my declining state of Life, and that in a little time, I must go the way of all the living, do make and publish this my last will and testament, revoking all others previously made.
