John Robertson's Will

The last Will and Testament of John Robertson

I John Robinson of Lawrence County, State of Tennessee, being of sound mind and memory, but weak in body, do make, ordain and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following to wit: I will that my body shall be decently interred in a manner suitable to my situation in life, and that my family as expressed debts shall be first paid and for the purpose of raising money to discharge my debts it is my wish & will that enough of my ^{real} property may be sold to raise money for that purpose.

And it is my will that all my property after the payment of my just debts to the real and personal estate together my Executors herein after named

and that my beloved wife Mary have the use and enjoyment of said property during her natural life or widowhood as shall be her with the power & authority to raise my younger children in decency & to give them a suitable education and until my youngest child arrives at the age of sixteen at which time I wish my Executors to sell the whole of my personal estate both real and personal & to divide the proceeds thereof among my children equally the youngest child arriving at the age of sixteen I give him a child's part when my said youngest child arrives at the age of sixteen & until that time shall go to the support & education of my young children according to the discretion of my Executors & my said property in the balance thereof after paying my debts shall be so preserved & increase as to be comfortable & convenient & more than the wants of my family require & that in my Executors a discretionary power to sell so much of the said as will reduce it to suit the wants and convenience of the family I do hereby constitute & appoint my beloved wife Mary Executor & my friend John Waples Esq. Executor of the my last will & Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 10th day of September 1834. John Robertson Test.

Further for reasons well known to myself my wife is that my daughter Nancy young or her legal representative should receive one shilling out of my estate and no more and that Fanny Temple daughter of said Nancy should be and equal heir and legatee and share in my estate with my children hereafter to be named subject to the deductions hereafter to be mentioned and further it is my desire that my estate should be sold to the highest bidder among my equals after the death of my wife and that the balance of my estate real and personal should be disposed of under the direction of my Executors hereafter to be named that and that an equal division of the proceeds of my estate be made between my Legatees now to be named subject to the deductions hereafter mentioned that my sons Robert Maxmilian John and Sepia my daughter Sally Bumpass Betty Egell Peggy Egell Susan Bumpass including my grand daughters Fanny Temple as before mentioned that regarding my Executors to charge the following children and I am Nancy with the following sums for the benefit of my estate for property by them already received of me that is said Robert with the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars my son John with the sum of four hundred dollars my son Sepia with the sum of five hundred dollars my daughter Sally Bumpass with the sum of one hundred dollars my daughter Betty Egell with the sum of twenty dollars my daughter Peggy Egell with the sum of ten dollars my grand daughter Fanny Temple with the sum of one hundred dollars which several sums with which my said children and said Fanny are charged are to be considered as part of my by them already received and my Executors hereafter to be named are required to deduct the above sums with which they are charged and to pay the balance remaining but it is further my will that in addition of my estate as above if the sum with which either of my said Legatees are charged should amount to more than their share I do not desire that they should make any actual payment but to my estate but that my estate should lose the same. Lastly it is my will and desire that my two sons Robert and Maxmilian should be my Executors to execute this my last will and Testament.
