The last Will and Testament of John Robertson

I John Robertson of Lawrence County, State of Tennessee, being of sound mind and memory, but weak in body, do make, ordain and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit: I will that body shall be decently interred in a manner suitable to estimation in life, and that my funeral expenses & debts shall be first paid and for the purpose of raising money to discharge my debts it is my will & will that enough of my property may be sold to raise money for that purpose.

It is my will that all my property after the payment of my just debts to the real and personal effects together with my Executor's overhead be sold to pay out of my estate and next that my beloved wife Anne and

and that my beloved wife Mary have it, use and enjoyment of said property during her natural life as a widow to enable her with the proceeds & her own efforts raise my youngest child in decency & to give them a suitable education and until my youngest child arrives at the age of sixteen at which time I wish my executors to sell the whole of my estate, both the real and personal & to divide the proceeds among my children equally so requiring a child half of my wife should marry before youngest child arrives at the age of sixteen I give him a child's part when my said youngest child arrives at the age of sixteen & will that the use and profits of my property until the same time shall go to the support & education of my young children according to discretion of my executors of my live property in the balance thereof after paying my debts shall be proper & increase as to be troublesome & inconvenient than the wants of my family require that ten my executors a necessary power to sell so much of the same as will reduce it to suit the wants and convenience of the family I do hereby constitute & appoint my beloved wife Mary Executor & my friend John Pearson my Executor of my last will & testament to testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 3^d day of September 1834 John Robertson
