I also give and bequeath to her during her natural life all debts due me or moneys on hand. I also give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth the use and possession during her natural life of my two negroes Jerry and Henry and about one hundred and ten acres of land including my residence and bounded as follows, beginning on the South boundary of my tract of land at the South East corner of the tract hereinafter unto Samuel S. M. Lean thence East with the line between me & Estes about 123 poles to a white oak & post oak thence North to Reuben Grippie's line thence West to his corner 142 poles thence South 48 poles, West to S. M. Lean's land & South to the beginning and by adding the one acre mill tract & 82½ acres purchased of J. C. Minight both given the above call, will make about the 106 acres hereby bequeathing the land and negroes to be encumbered with the use of one acre now & to be used as a burying ground and with the bequest hereinafter made to Sarah Annandea.
 3rd. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Annandea her choice of hoes, out of my stock and two cows and calves, her beavers, bed, bedding and furniture, saddle and bridle, and such other stock as her mother may see proper to give her at living at her marriage, and if she marry,

in the life time of my wife she is to enjoy and receive an equal portion of profits from the tillage, rent, use or hire of the aforesaid 106 acres of land and negroes Jerry & Silvey, and for and during the time she may remain unmarried after the death of my wife she is to have and enjoy the use and possession of the aforesaid 106 acres of land and negroes Jerry and Silvey that she may be the more certain of a more comfortable subsistence. and in case of her marriage after the death of my wife I give and bequeath to her absolute one of two choices viz; the aforesaid 106 acres of land or the negroes Jerry & Silvey, and if she choose the negroes the land to be sold and the proceeds divided equally among my heirs, and if she make choice of the land then the negroes are to be sold and proceeds divided likewise, and in case of her marriage before the death of my wife my request is for her still to live with my wife on the place and the land and negroes be employed for the mutual support and benefit of my wife and her and family — 4th I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel D. McLean, William and Charles each of them a tract of land and negro boy with other property to the amount of eight or nine hundred dollars making them about equal with Sam. and I, but my son Ephraim having been unfortunately in the loss of his boy by death, and inasmuch as some of my children may happen a loss by death of one of the negroes given to them on their leaving me, my wish and desire is that my negro man Ab. shall be given to such child or children as may already, or may hereafter during my life, have such misfortune, with a request to him or them that he be sold, or exchanged so as to be near his wife.

In addition to Item 4. I give to my son Samuel D. my negro boy Sam which he now has in possession.

6th I have also lent to each of my daughters who have married a negro girl. I now give them as follows to my daughter Polly Hill and the heirs of her

body at her death my negro woman Jenny and child (now in her possession) and further increase. To my daughter Elizabeth Nappan and the heirs of her body at her death my negro girl Charlotte & child now in her possession and further increase, and to my daughter Margaret and the heirs of her body at her death my negro woman Manrova & child (now in her possession and further increase.

7th A. M. Hill having been given 25 or 30 acres of land off the tract where I now live. I hereby give and bequeath unto Samuel M. Nappan and Stephanus Brady the balance of my home tract of land after deducting therefrom the bequest to Samuel D. and my wife & daughter Sarah Annanosa. 8th at the death of my wife I wish the stock farming tools & household and kitchen furniture and my occupant adjoining upper mill or Miller tract of land to be sold with such other property as is not here- in otherwise bequeathed and divided equally amongst my mine counting the heirs of Robert J. McLean as one.

9th & lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Charles McLean, my son-in-law Samuel M. Nappan and Stephanus Brady and my son Samuel D. McLean and my wife Elizabeth McLean and Frank- lin Bruchman my executors this 8th day of June 1844. Samuel M. McLean (Seal)

A codicil to the Last & Testament of Samuel McLean the said Will bearing date the eighth day of June 1844. Whereas in the providence of God, my wife Elizabeth who is provided for in Item second of said will, has departed this life such being the case I now make and revoke Item second in said will and all other parts of it relating to her as well as some other parts of it that I shall change in consequence of different transactions having taken place in my family since the date of the aforesaid will.

1st Having married again to Susan McLean under the provisions and stipulations of a marriage contract

which contrains my wish so that my will shall be filled out agreeable thereto with this further provision that if my wife should wish to leave my place she is to have my negro woman named Dice with the rest of her property as named in the contract to wait on her and so with her as she thinks best and as in my will of which this is a codicil, my children has all been provided for with the exception of Sarah Amanda, but as I have since the date of my will I have given off to Samuel Napson, Thomas Brady and Samuel D. McLean their parts of my estate at present by Deed of gift the balance of my estate I leave in the possession of my wife Susan and my daughter S. A. McLean to live on and be used as agreed to in the marriage contract but if my loving wife Susan should choose to remove then she is to take Dice with her and leave the place in the hands of my representatives. (Except she should alter her name before should leave my place, in that case she is to leave the place and Dice to my representatives, as agreed to in the marriage contract) and should that take and S. A. Sunday should remain single I give and bequeath to her my negro man named Jerry and my negro woman named Selany. I also give unto her my home tract of land including a small tract I got of William McVingie on the East, the land I willed to Napson & Brady on the North, and a one acre mill seat on the South, the whole making 135 or forty acres. (With the exception of 10 acres of land which I leave to my son Samuel D. McLean lying along the East boundary line I have conveyed by Deed of Gift the place whereon the said Samuel D. McLean now lives) I also give her, her choice of two horses, 3 beds, stands and furniture, her saddle and bridle, and 8 sheep, 20 head of hogs, 2 cows and calves, the waggon, and two yoke of oxen, her house hold and kitchen furniture, 3 plows, and two pair hams and chains with single trees and clevises, 2 hay, her geese and poultry of all kinds, 1 axe, one mattress, her loom and apparatus belonging thereto, her barrels and all of her wearing clothes. (Found in the hand writing of Saml. McLean and Proven at the May Term of the county court 1850)
