

authorize and empower my with the advice & consent of my executor, from time to time, to sell for cash or in time, or exchange for other property any property of which may be seized and possessed - or mortgage should be, and the proceeds of such sale or exchange to be continuous or renewed "ad libitum" and the proceeds thereof from time to time to constitute a part of my estate in Trust as aforesaid.

Should either of my daughters marry during the widowhood of my wife; upon their arrival at the age of eighteen years, or upon the arrival at lawful age (21 years) of either or any son or daughter it is my wish that an estimate (as nearly as practicable) be made of the total net value of my estate, by my executor (whose appointment and valuation is to be binding upon my children) and the whole to be divided into two equal parts, as near as practicable; the one of which part to constitute a fund in property or money, chosen in action or stock for distribution equally amongst my children upon their arrival at the ages aforesaid; but this part to be used and possessed by my wife as aforesaid in common with the minor children until the majority of the first child when he or she is to receive an equal moiety of said half of my estate with the minor children - and so on with such child as it may reach the aforesaid.

The other moiety of my estate not to be subject to any distribution or partition during the widowhood of my wife. My executors are to charge each child with the amount received, so that upon the death of my wife the whole of my estate to be distributed in such manner as to make the parts equal to each child, and if there be children not of age at her death guardians are to be appointed for such minors, who will take charge of their estates, Grand children of lawful issue to share the proportion and their parents if the parents be dead.

However should my wife think proper and marry again I desire that my executor procure for her with the means of my estate thus left her during widowhood a tract of land worth Twenty - five hundred dollars for her use and benefit during

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her natural life and at her death to revert to my estate for distribution amongst my children & grand children as aforesaid. I also in the event of such marriage give to my said wife to her sole and separate use free from the control of her husband to be disposed of as she may see proper during her life time, and at her death to be equally divided with all the heirs of her body Two thousand dollars in such property of my estate as she may select, the value to be appraised by my executor, also upon such marriage I desire that guardians be appointed for my minor children (either of which guardians shall be of kin to or the husband of my wife) and that my estate (after the legacy to my wife aforesaid) be divided so as to make all my children equal, calculating in the amount any advances which may have been made to any child previously.

Having now briefly ~~expressed~~ but I hope plainly disposed of the property and effects with which it has pleased Providence to give me control. I commend my soul to the arms of a kind and merciful Saviour & Redeemer "Christ Jesus" Humbly trusting and fondly hoping that through the tender mercies and loving kindness of such Saviour my children may all be early taught the knowledge of Him whom to know is life eternal. Lastly, I desire that my friends and relations Elbridge T. Chumpton & William J. Buchanan act as my executors - upon the death of said Chumpton I desire that William Chumpton (if living) take his place, if not, John M. Chumpton & upon the death of said Buchanan I desire that his place be filled with my father if living, if not, then Gabriel B. Buchanan if of age or living if not Mr. B. Buchanan.
