Reeler, that the said tract of land of two hundred and sixteen acres above mentioned, and all of my personal estate and the increase thereof (except said slave Jim and Fanny) be sold and the proceeds thereof be divided equally share and share alike between my three children to wit, John D. Mary F. and William C. Reeler upon their arrival respectively at the age of twenty-one years.

Reeler that said two slaves be emancipated according to the laws of the State of Georgia, and in the event that cannot support themselves by their labor, at the time of the marriage or death of my wife Mary F. Reeler or any time thereafter, that my executor hereafter mentioned allow them a reasonable support out of my estate during their lives.

Item 8th. It is my will and desire, and I hereby direct my executor hereafter mentioned as soon as

practicable after my death to collect all my judgments, notes, accounts and other securities of debt, and place the same at interest and after allowing the necessary sum for support and maintenance for my wife and a sum sufficient to the support and education of my children, the balance of the proceeds to be equally divided share and share alike between my three children upon their reaching the age of twenty-one years.

Item 9th. It is my will and desire, and I hereby direct my executor hereafter mentioned to pay over to my wife from time to time, such sum of money as may be necessary and proper for her support, and the support and education of my said children.

Item 10th.
