Allen about three hundred Dollars beside his horse saddle and the will to my Doctor polley Strayhorn and his body care, my blacke Gored, Jane and his body iners I will to my Doctor Mearns, Paten Martha a blacke gored and his in cress to the said Mearns and his body care now as Jacob Allen has staid longer with me then any of my children I will him the five shares out eight of Land that use to belong to Jacob Biffle as I owned five shares out of eight now as to the witch is Anderson, I and Eliza with Jane & John W. & Martha & E. Allen I want my wife Catharine as they may or become of age to give them as much as I have give the elder ones witch is bout three hundred Dollars beside a horse saddle and Bede & the now if she aut able to do it at that time it must be Dem. out of the Land and Nigros at her death then I want them all to share and share alike with the property after the younge ones has been made equa to the Rest all but Jacob now I appoint Robert H. Allen & Jacob Allen my executors without excoing security of them seal and sign this day and date above written.
