

Will of Mrs Eliza S Smith

Know all men by these presents; That I Eliza S Smith of the City of Pasadena County of Los Angeles State of California, of the Age of 74 years and being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and not acting under known fraud or undue influence of any person whatsoever do make publish and declare this my last will and testament in manner following, that is to say:

I

I direct that my body be decently buried with proper regard to my station and condition in life and the circumstances of my estate.

II

I direct that my executor hereinafter named as soon as he has sufficient funds in ~~my~~ his hands, pay my funeral expenses, the expenses of my last sickness and all just debts existing against me at the time of my decease.

III

I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved son Frank DeWitt Smith, all of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate of every name and nature whatever whether real, personal or mixed owned by me at the time of my death.

IV

In the event of the death of my son Frank DeWitt Smith and myself at the same time by accident or otherwise, or in the event of the death of my son before my death, and before I have opportunity of changing my Will, I then give, devise and bequeath my estate as follows, to wit:

To the surviving widow of my said son Frank DeWitt Smith during her natural life or until she should remarry, the sum of sixty five dollars per month, and direct that the same be paid to her as a professed payment each month by the executor of this my last will and testament, and payment thereof shall be continued by my trustee herein named during her natural life or until she re-marries.

To Susan Bird Gross widow of my brother Russell B Gross of Little Rock Arkansas the sum of Five thousand Dollars

To Granville Gross of Pasadena California the sum of two thousand (2000) dollars

To Mary J Smith of Las Vegas New Mexico the sum of Five thousand (5000) dollars,

To Miss Jessie Boyd of South Pasadena California the sum of three hundred (300) dollars

To Miss Lizzie B Perkins of South Pasadena California the sum of three hundred (300) dollars,

To Miss Nettie Devine of St Paul Minnesota the sum of one hundred dollars

To Miss Alice Sinclair of Lawrence Kansas one hundred (100) dollars

To Miss Belle Sinclair Dobson of Lawrence Kansas one hundred (100) dollars,

To Mrs. Gertrude Austin Brown of Minneapolis Minnesota the sum of three hundred (300) dollars. To Agnes Austin of Minneapolis Minnesota the sum of three hundred (300) dollars, To Mrs Rose Mills Williams of Albuquerque, New Mexico the sum of five hundred (500) dollars

To Mary de Graw of St Paul Minnesota the sum of five hundred (500) dollars,

To Mrs Cordelia Swindell of Denver Colorado the sum of four hundred dollars.

To Joseph E Gay of New York City New York the sum of Four thousand six hundred (4600) dollars. To Eva Gross wife of Granville Gross the sum of three hundred (300) dollars

V

In the matter of the bequest hereinafter made to Mary J Smith I direct that the same, to-wit the sum of Five thousand (5000) dollars, shall be paid to the title insurance and trust company of the City of Los Angeles State of California, and shall be by said company invested in either five per cent or six per cent first mortgage bonds, on long time and held in trust by them and to pay the income derived therefrom to the said Mary J Smith as long as she lives, and at her death the said bonds shall either be turned over to, or sold and the proceeds turned over to the trustees of the Sanitorium fund herein after named mentioned to be used by them also as herein after mentioned

VI

In explanation of the bequest hereinafter made to Granville Gross and to Mrs Susan Bird Gross I make this statement: That the difference between the two bequests is not due to the reason that I feel more kindly to one than the other but is due entirely to the fact that Granville Gross has been much more fortunate in the accumulation of property, and is already well provided for, and for that reason and no other, I give the larger sum to Mrs Susan Bird Gross

VII

I give devise and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate to the Union Trust and Savings Bank of Pasadena California and to its successors in trust, in trust however for the purpose herein after expressed namely: That they shall take, hold and use all the rest, residue and

Remainder of my estate, and shall gather the same together as quickly as possible and convert the same into a fund for the purpose of, first to place at interest in good interest bearing securities the sum of twenty thousand (20000) dollars, for my grand children which are the children of my son Frank DeWitt Smith and wife, and apply the income derived therefrom to the maintenance and education of said children until they arrive at the age of twenty five years each, at which time the said sum of twenty thousand (20000) dollars shall be paid to each of them, Second, to the establishing at Pasadena California or at some point as near Pasadena as the same can be done to advantage, a Sanatorium for consumptive persons, the same to be known as the "Joseph Gay Smith Sanatorium" Said trustee shall take charge of the fund so created, and shall procure a site for the establishment of said Sanatorium to the best possible advantage, and shall manage, control and conduct the same in such manner as to make it pay the expenses for conducting the same if possible, and if necessary, to solicit others in its behalf, and to secure endowments of funds for that purpose; the object being to establish such an institution as would admit persons afflicted with consumption whether they have sufficient means to pay their expenses or not, it being my desire that such arrangements shall be made as will admit poor people who have no means to pay for treatment and maintenance, as well as those who are able to pay for such care as would be given to them in an institution of such character, thereby giving to my trustee hereinbefore named the full power and authority to provide for the management and conduct of said business; leaving it to the sound discretion and best judgment of the governing body of said trustee, as to how the same shall be done, having full faith and confidence in the honesty, ability and integrity of purpose of said trustee, Also that it will use its utmost endeavor to carry out to the best of its ability, my wishes in regard to the establishment of the Sanatorium hereinbefore mentioned It is my desire however, that they shall incur no debt of any kind or character, which will endanger in any way the permanency of said Sanatorium, as I would much prefer to have a smaller institution, free from debt, than a larger one encumbered with obligations which might endanger its permanency, and thereby prevent the doing of good to suffering humanity which is loudly called for at this time.

VIII

In the event that the laws of California will not at the time of my death permit the disposition of the rest residue

and remainder of my estate in accordance with paragraph seventh of this my Will, then I give, devise and bequeath such portion of said rest, residue and remainder of my estate as follows to wit: To my brother Granville M. Cross of Pasadena California the sum of two thousand (2000) dollars, and to my sister-in-law Susan Bird Gross the sum of two thousand (2000) dollars each to be in addition to the bequests hereinbefore made to them and the remainder if any to my two grand children hereinbefore mentioned, to wit: the children of my son Frank DeWitt Smith, share and share alike, the same to be placed with said trustee hereinbefore named, to wit: The Union Trust and Savings Bank of Pasadena California on the same terms and under same conditions as hereinbefore mentioned in paragraph seventh hereof.

IX

I direct that the bequests hereinbefore made shall be paid by my executor in the following order, to wit: to my two ~~sons~~ grand children mentioned hereinbefore as the children of my son Frank DeWitt Smith payment in full. Second to Mary J. Smith and to my sister-in-law Susan Bird Gross, Third: All of the other bequests herein made shall be paid in pro rata proportion out of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate.

X

I hereby nominate and appoint my son, Frank DeWitt Smith, of Pasadena California, the executor of this my last Will and Testament, he to serve as such without bonds of any kind whatever hereby revoking all former Wills by me made, giving to my executor full power and authority to sell and convey any portion or all of my property of whatever kind and wherever the same may be situated, without any order of Court therefor, or without having to give or publish any notice of any kind whatever. In case of the death of my son Frank DeWitt Smith, I then appoint as the executors of this my last Will and Testament, my brother Granville M. Cross and Lea L. McLaughlin with full power and authority as granted hereinbefore to my son Frank DeWitt Smith, except as to the giving of bonds.

Mrs Smith Will Contained

This is a Codicil to be added to the last Will and testament of me Eliza S Smith of Pasadena California which will bear date the 19th day of March 1914.

I do hereby ratify and Confirm my said Will in all respects, save so far as any part thereof shall be omitted or altered by this present Codicil, and I do hereby change the same in particular as follows to wit: First: I revoke, Abrogate and declare null and void the bequest, in paragraph fourth, in said Will hereinabove referred to to miss Nettie Quisen of St Paul Minnesota of the sum of one hundred (100) dollars for the reason that she is dead.

Second: I revoke, Abrogate and declare null and void the bequest in paragraph fourth, in said Will ~~hereinabove~~ to Joseph E Bay of New York City, New York of the sum of four thousand six hundred (4600) dollars, for the reason that he is dead.

Third: The bequest in paragraph fourth in said Will to Mrs Gertrude Austin Bowen, of Minneapolis Minnesota I change from three hundred (300) dollars to one hundred (100) dollars.

Fourth: The bequest in paragraph fourth in said Will to Bessie Austin of Minneapolis Minnesota I change from three hundred (300) dollars to one hundred (100) dollars.

Fifth: The bequest in paragraph fourth in said Will to Eva Gress, Wife of Graville M Gress, I hereby change from three hundred (300) dollars to five hundred (500) dollars.

Sixth: In paragraph tenth of said Will, wherein there is bequeathed in the event of the death of my son Frank Dewart Smith before my death, the bequest to my two grand children (the children of my said son Frank Dewart Smith) of twenty thousand dollars each, I direct that, after the payment of the expenses of administration and expenses of my last sickness and all just debts, said bequests to my two said grand children shall have preference over any other bequests in full said Will by me made, and that if my estate is not sufficient to pay the other bequests in full, then they shall be prorated and paid in ratio and proportion to the amount of each.

Seventh: In paragraph tenth of said Will I hereby revoke the appointment of my brother Graville M Gress and Los. A. McLaughlin to act as executors of said Will in case of the death of my son Frank Dewart Smith whom I have in said Will appointed as the executor of my said Will, and I do hereby appoint W C Crowell and H G Simpson of Pasadena California as the executors of my said Will in case of the death of my said son Frank, and I do hereby give to the said W C Crowell and

H G Simpson the same powers and under the same conditions as to bond, order of Court witness etc, as is given to my said son Frank Dewart Smith in said original Will.

And I do hereby revoke all former and other Codicils by me at any time heretofore made.
