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Joseph Patrick East Will.

I Joseph Patrick being in perfect mind and memory calling to mind that I have to die, do now make and publish this my last will and testament in full and perfect sense and give to my wife Elizabeth two negro girls, Lucy and Lily during her natural life and after her death them and their offspring to be equally divided among all my children, I also give to my daughter Sophia all my father's land and furniture, the balance of my household and kitchen furniture, I give to my wife Elizabeth, likewise one horse and two cows, my son Austin being my still and regent and samantha half acres of land, and crop, now in the place the said land lies on farries creek, I likewise will that my wife pay four pair of deer, and three head of horses and eight head of cattle to be sold at twelve months credit, then my lawful debts to be paid out of the money of this property, bring, the balance to be equally divided between my two daughters, Patsy Franklin and Sophia Patrick, signed, sealed and acknowledged in the presence of this 10th day of September 1823.
