same rough flour & two milk cows  
Writings are made this 10th November 1818

the support of the widow & children for  
twelve months; Ten barrels of Corn five hundred  
weights of Pork, Two hundred weights of Seed Cotton

to purchase sugar Coffee &c.

I Martin Flynt of Lincoln County and State  
of Tennessee being weak in body but in perfect  
mind and memory do constitute this my last  
will & Testament in the manner & form following  
(W<sup>it</sup>) I give and bequeath to my beloved wife  
Elizabeth the house and land which I now live and  
all the Negroes, and stock of every description  
during her natural life or widowhood Except each  
Child is to have a Negro about the same size as  
they marry or come of age and also a line bed  
and low chest and bed and furniture &c. and it  
is my wish for my sons to have Negro boys  
and my daughters Negro girls and if the Negroes are  
not of Equal value, for them that gets them  
of the lowest value to have some other property  
to make them all equal

I do also appoint Richard Flynt & John C.  
Flynt Executors to the above will given under  
my hand this 19th day of April 1815
