son Abner Reed and my daughter Hanny Reed
and Polly Reed. Also I give to my son Abner Reed
one Baylors coat claimed by him. Also give to
my daughter Polly Reed one chest bed and furniture
claimed by her. Also give to my wife Elizabeth Reed
one bed and furniture claimed by her. Also is
my wife and desire that my children that is Mary
with me at my death and take care of me and
my stock together with my plantation tools to be
equally divided among such children. Also the
remaining part of my household and kitchen
furniture, But should one of these my last named
