Fourthly I bequeath and leave all of the balance
 of my estate to be equally divided amongst the
 share of my children Martha Campbell McConner
 and Martin, Elizabeth C. Green Betty C. Green
 William L. London. Except Mary Mc Kershner
 share her ten dollars, and the balance a sum
 which would make her equal with her sisters
 above named to be left to the children of said Mary
 McConner.

I have paid debts and appoint William Edmiston
 executor of my will, whole and sole executor
 to this my last will and testament signed sealed

 the seal of said Court at office in Saybrook the
 day of October A.D. 1824.
