 I John Morgan being in good memory do
 make this my last will and Testament
 I give to my Daughter Nancy one Negro
 Girl Kitty and horse bridle & saddle and bed
 and furniture & one cow. I do give to my
 Daughter Martha one Negro girl Dolly
 one horse bridle & saddle, one bed & furniture
 and one cow. I do give to my Daughter
 Spatin a one Negro girl Mary horse bridle
 and saddle, one bed & furniture & one cow
 I give to my Daughter Sus an one Negro
 Girl. Easter one horse saddle and bridle, one
 bed and furniture, and one cow. I give to
 my Daughter Mary one Negro girl, I lay
 one horse bridle and saddle, one bed & furniture
 and one cow, I give to my Son Sam Shash
 Morgan one Negro boy Frank, one horse
 bridle and saddle, one bed & furniture, and
 I give to my Son Hiram Morgan one
 Negro boy Bill, one horse bridle and saddle
 and bed and furniture, I give to my Son
 John Morgan one Negro boy Matt one
 horse bridle & saddle bed and furniture,
 I do leave the whole of Land to be
 Equally divided between my three Sons
 above mentioned, except a tract of land
 on boiling fork of Elk river in Franklin
 County which is to be sold, I do give
 to my Wife Mary Morgan the use of
 my plantation and all Negroes that
 is not above mentioned & farming
 tools & stock with the house hold furni-
 -ture that is ^{not} mentioned for the use of
 Raising and Schooling of my children
 and then at her death or discretion

I do give to all my Daughters above mentioned, a negro a piece of equal value and then the whole of all my personal Estate property to be equally divided, between all my Children namely Nancy, Charles, Martha, Malinda, Hiram, Susan John, and Mary Morgan, I do give to my Son John Morgan his part of the Land that will take the plantation which now live on

An abridgement to my will & Testament
If my wife Mary Morgan Decases before my two young Children comes of age the use of all my negroes, plantation and Stock, and house hold furniture and farming tools as before mentioned, is to be for the use of raising & schooling of my ^{two} Children John, and Mary Morgan and then to be divided, as aforesaid in the will, I do leave my wife, and Son Charles Morgan, & Saml Bright, executor
