I Joseph Patrick being in perfect mind and memory calling to mind that I have to die, do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament in full and perfect sense and give to my wife Elizabeth two negro girls, Lucy and Lily during her natural life and after her death them and their offspring to be equally divided among all my children, I also give to my daughter Sophia all my father's land and furniture, the balance of my household and kitchen furniture, I give to my wife Elizabeth, likewise one horse and two cows, my son Austin being my still and regent and samantha half acres of land, and crop, new at the place the said land lies on farries creek, I likewise will that my wife pay for pair of deer, and three head of horses and eight head of cattle to be sold at twelve months credit, then my lawful debts to be paid out of the money of this property, bring, the balance to be equally divided between my two daughters, Patsy Franklin and Sophia Patrick, being signed and acknowledged in the presence of this 10th day of September 1823.

In the name of god Amen I Eli Garrett of the County of Lincoln and State of Tennessee, being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life,

do make and publish this my last will and testament in the manner and form following: I give and bequeath to my wife Agatha during her life of widowhood my negro woman Study and my boy Isaac, also my sorrel mare and family, Biber, saddle & bridle. To my daughter my negro girl Lucy, Emily, also my sorrel, scott with a blaze face, saddle and bridle. The balance of my property consisting of two negroes, three head of horses, three hogs, sheep, crop of corn, cotton farming tools, household and kitchen furniture to be sold for discharge of my just debts and if there is any thing more than enough, the remainder to be equally divided among all my children and in case of my wife death or marriage the property will be sold to be equally divided among my children. I have hereunto set my hand and seal, I signed my son Greenberry Garrett and my wife Agatha Garrett Executor and executrix to this my last will and Testament, Given under my hand and seal this 2nd of December 1823.
